2 Coordination of Spaceport Initiatives. It is the intent of the 2. Legislature that the Texas Aerospace Commission, the Texas 3 4 Department of Economic Development, and the Texas Department 5 of Transportation [Governor], or their successor agencies, 6 coordinate efforts and spending related to developing a reusable launch facility or Spaceport. 7 These agencies shall 8 [develop<sub>7</sub>] maintain[<sub>7</sub>] and adhere to a memorandum of 9 understanding that is [was] established January 1, 2004 [2002], that details the specific responsibilities of each 10 agency and continues to provide interagency coordination and 11 support to achieve the objective of establishing a Spaceport 12 and developing Texas' low cost launch capabilities. 13
