S.B. No. 433

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the authorization of airport districts and the issuance
3 of bonds and the exercise of eminent domain by the districts.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. LEGISLATIVE DECLARATION; PURPOSE. (a) The 6 economic well-being of the state and the general welfare of its 7 residents require adequate, safe, secure, and efficient aviation 8 facilities at a reasonable cost.

9 (b) The purpose of this Act is to authorize the creation by 10 the state, counties, and municipalities, through their independent 11 or joint action, airport districts, corporate and politic, 12 constituting political subdivisions of the state, for the purpose 13 of:

14 (1) acquiring and improving airports, heliports, air
 15 navigation facilities, and related facilities;

16 (2) financing the cost of the activities listed under 17 Subdivision (1) of this subsection by the issuance of bonds or other 18 obligations of a district payable from the income of the district 19 and otherwise secured to the extent permitted by law without the 20 incurrence of debt by the state or by another political 21 subdivision; and

(3) promoting and facilitating transportation by air
 from or to points located within the state, to the benefit and
 general welfare of the state, including its political subdivisions

1 and inhabitants.

2 SECTION 2. AIRPORT DISTRICTS. Title 3, Transportation 3 Code, is amended by adding Chapter 27 to read as follows:

4	CHAPTER 27. AIRPORT DISTRICTS
5	SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS
6	Sec. 27.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
7	(1) "Aircraft" means a contrivance invented, used, or
8	designed for navigation of or flight in the air, except a parachute
9	or other contrivance designed for use primarily as safety
10	equipment.
11	(2) "Air navigation facility" means a facility used
12	in, available for use in, or designed for use in aid of air
13	navigation, including a structure, mechanism, light, beacon,
14	marker, communicating system, or other instrumentality or device
15	used or useful as an aid or constituting an advantage or convenience
16	to the safe taking-off, navigation, and landing of aircraft, or the
17	safe and efficient operation or maintenance of an airport,
18	including any combination of facilities listed in this subdivision.
19	(3) "Airport" means an area of land or water that is
20	used, or intended for use, for the landing, taking-off, storage,
21	parking, or dispersal of aircraft, including:
22	(A) any appurtenant areas that are used or
23	intended for use for airport buildings, facilities, or
24	rights-of-way; and
25	(B) airport buildings, structures, and
26	facilities located on the area of land or water.
27	(4) "Airport facility" means a building, structure,

1	land, right-of-way, equipment, or instrumentality used or to be
2	used in connection with the construction, enlargement,
3	development, maintenance, or operation of an airport.
4	(5) "Board" means the board of directors of a
5	district.
6	(6) "District" means a public corporation organized
7	under this chapter.
8	(7) "Indenture" means a mortgage, indenture of
9	mortgage, deed of trust, trust agreement, or trust indenture
10	executed by a district as security for bonds.
11	Sec. 27.002. ASSISTANCE BY STATE OR LOCAL ENTITIES. (a) A
12	county, municipality, or other political subdivision of the state,
13	including a public corporation, may, with or without consideration:
14	(1) lend or donate money to a district;
15	(2) provide that all or part of the taxes or funds
16	available to the subdivision or required by law to be used by the
17	subdivision for airport purposes shall be transferred or paid
18	directly to a district;
19	(3) cause water, sewer, or drainage facilities or any
20	other facilities that the subdivision is empowered to provide to be
21	furnished adjacent to or in connection with an airport or air
22	navigation facility;
23	(4) donate, sell, convey, transfer, or lease to a
24	district any land, property, franchise, grant, easement, license,
25	or lease that the subdivision owns;
26	(5) donate, sell, convey, or lease an airport, airport
27	property, or any interest in an airport or airport property owned by

the subdivision to a district; 1 (6) donate, transfer, assign, sell, or convey to a 2 3 district any right, title, or interest that the subdivision has in a lease, contract, agreement, license, or property; 4 5 (7) furnish, dedicate, close, pave, repair, install, 6 grade, regrade, plan, or replan streets, roads, roadways, and 7 walks: (A) from established streets or roads to an 8 airport or air <u>navigation facility; or</u> 9 10 (B) abutting or adjacent to an airport or air 11 navigation facility; (8) take any other action that is necessary or 12 13 convenient to aid and cooperate with a district in the planning, undertaking, construction, or operation of an airport or air 14 15 navigation facility; and 16 (9) furnish, at the request of a district, fire and air crash equipment and personnel to properly operate the equipment at 17 18 an airport or aircraft landing area owned, operated, or under the jurisdiction of the district or train district personnel in fire, 19 20 crash, and rescue. (b) All transfers of land, licenses, easements, or other 21 22 property are subject to the continuing right of a utility to maintain existing facilities in those locations and to be 23 reimbursed for any required relocation, removal, or adjustment of 24 25 those facilities. Sec. 27.003. APPLICATION OF OTHER LAW. An airport district 26 27 created under this chapter is not an airport authority under

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Section 12, Article IX, Texas Constitution. 1 2 [Sections 27.004-27.050 reserved for expansion] 3 SUBCHAPTER B. CREATION AND EXPANSION Sec. 27.051. INCORPORATION. (a) A district may be 4 organized as a public corporation under this chapter. 5 6 (b) At least three natural persons shall file with the 7 governing body of one or more counties or municipalities an 8 application in writing for permission to incorporate a public 9 corporation under this chapter and shall attach to the application 10 a proposed form of articles of incorporation for the corporation. (c) If each governing body with which the application is 11 filed adopts a resolution approving the form of the articles of 12 incorporation and authorizing the formation of a public 13 corporation, the applicants under Subsection (b) become the 14 15 incorporators of and shall incorporate the district as a public 16 corporation under this chapter using the form of the articles 17 approved. 18 Sec. 27.052. ADDITIONAL COUNTIES OR MUNICIPALITIES. An additional county or municipality may become part of a district if 19 each additional county or municipality and each county or 20 municipality in the district adopts a resolution consenting to the 21 22 inclusion of the additional county or municipality in the district. Sec. 27.053. INCLUSION IN DISTRICT. On the inclusion of a 23 county or municipality in a district, either initially or as an 24 additional member, all rights, contracts, obligations, and 25 property, both real and personal, of a municipality or county used 26 27 for or in relation to transportation by air shall vest in the

1	district created under this subchapter unless otherwise specified
2	by the resolution including the municipality or county in the
3	<u>district.</u>
4	Sec. 27.054. STATE JOINING AIRPORT DISTRICT. The governor,
5	on behalf of the state, may authorize the state to join in the
6	creation of a district under this subchapter or to join an existing
7	district created under this subchapter.
8	Sec. 27.055. CONTENTS OF CERTIFICATE OF INCORPORATION. The
9	certificate of incorporation of a district shall state:
10	(1) the name and county of residence of each person
11	forming the district;
12	(2) the name of the district, which must include the
13	words "airport district";
14	(3) the duration of the district or, if the duration is
15	perpetual, the fact that the district is of perpetual duration;
16	(4) the names of the governmental entities in the
17	district and the date on which the:
18	(A) governing body of the county or municipality
19	adopted the resolution authorizing the incorporation of the
20	district or consented to the inclusion of the county or
21	municipality in the district; or
22	(B) governor authorized the state to join in the
23	creation of the district or the existing district;
24	(5) the proposed location in this state of the
25	principal office of the district; and
26	(6) any other matters relating to the district that
27	the incorporators choose to insert and that are not inconsistent

with this chapter or the laws of this state. 1 2 Sec. 27.056. INCORPORATION; EXECUTION AND FILING OF 3 ARTICLES. (a) The articles of incorporation of a district shall: 4 (1) be signed and acknowledged by the incorporators; 5 and 6 (2) have attached a certified copy of each of the 7 resolutions described by Section 27.051. (b) A district shall file its articles of incorporation, 8 with the documents required to be attached under Subsection (a), 9 10 with the secretary of state. (c) When a certificate of incorporation is issued by the 11 secretary of state after the filing of the articles and attached 12 13 documents, the district referred to in the certificate shall: (1) come into existence; 14 (2) constitute a public corporation under the name 15 16 listed in the certificate; and 17 (3) have all the rights and powers given to a district 18 under this chapter. (d) The articles must include the number and terms of board 19 20 members. A term may not exceed two years. 21 [Sections 27.057-27.100 reserved for expansion] 22 SUBCHAPTER C. BOARD OF DIRECTORS; ADMINISTRATION Sec. 27.101. BOARD OF DIRECTORS. (a) The governing body 23 of a district is a board with at least five but not more than nine 24 25 members appointed as follows: 26 (1) if the state alone authorizes a district, the 27 members shall be elected by the governor, the lieutenant governor,

1	and the speaker of the house of representatives with the total
2	number of members set out in the articles of incorporation of the
3	<u>district;</u>
4	(2) if the sole authorizing governmental entity is a
5	county, the commissioners court of the county shall appoint the
6	members with the number of members set out in the articles of
7	incorporation of the district; and
8	(3) in all other cases:
9	(A) one member shall be appointed by each
10	governing body of an authorizing governmental entity;
11	(B) one member shall be appointed by the
12	commissioners court of the county in which the principal office of
13	the district is located, if the county is not an authorizing
14	governmental entity; and
15	(C) one additional member shall be elected by the
16	governing bodies of each authorizing governmental entity and the
17	commissioners court of the county in which the principal office of
18	the district is located.
19	(b) Each member appointed by a governing body of an
20	authorizing governmental entity must reside in the authorizing
21	governmental entity. The additional member elected under
22	Subsection (a)(3)(C) must reside in any county electing the member.
23	(c) Other than the additional member elected under
24	Subsection (a)(3)(C), each authorizing governmental entity may
25	appoint the same number of members as any other authorizing
26	governmental entity.
27	(d) If the state joins in the creation of a district under

this chapter or joins an existing district created under this 1 chapter, the state is entitled to the number of board members agreed 2 3 on by the authorizing governmental entities and the state, but is entitled to at least one board member. The governor shall appoint 4 5 each board member representing the state. 6 Sec. 27.102. VACANCY; REMOVAL. (a) Except as provided by 7 Subsection (b), if a board member resigns, dies, or becomes 8 incapable or ineligible to act as a board member, a successor to serve the unexpired portion of the board member's term shall be 9 10 elected in the same manner provided by Section 27.101 as the board member whose unexpired term the successor is filling. 11 (b) If a vacancy in the office of the additional member 12 elected under Section 27.101(a)(3)(C) continues for more than 30 13 days, the governor shall, on the request of any governmental entity 14 15 that elected the member, appoint a successor. 16 (c) A board member may be removed from office. 17 Sec. 27.103. ELIGIBILITY. An officer of the state, a 18 county, or a municipality is not eligible to serve as a board member. 19 20 Sec. 27.104. TERMS. (a) The term of office of a board member is as set out in the articles of incorporation of a district. 21 22 (b) Board members serve staggered terms so that the term of 23 at least one member expires each year. Sec. 27.105. QUORUM. (a) Except as provided by Subsection 24 25 (b), a majority of the board members constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business. 26 (b) A meeting of a board may be adjourned by a majority of 27

1	the board members present or may be adjourned by a single board
2	member if the member is the only board member present at the
3	meeting.
4	(c) A vacancy on the board does not impair the right of a
5	quorum to exercise all the powers and duties of a district.
6	Sec. 27.106. MEETINGS. (a) A board shall hold regular
7	monthly meetings and any other meeting as provided for in the bylaws
8	of the district.
9	(b) A board may hold a special meeting at the call of the
10	chair of the district or two board members.
11	(c) Any matter on which the board is authorized to act may be
12	acted upon at a regular or special meeting.
13	(d) At the request of a board member, the vote on a question
14	before the board shall be taken by yeas and nays and entered on the
15	record. All board proceedings shall be reduced to writing by the
16	secretary of the district and open to board members and to the
17	public at all times. Copies of the proceedings, when certified by
18	the secretary of a district under its seal, are admissible in a
19	court as evidence of the matters certified in the proceedings.
20	Sec. 27.107. COMPENSATION. A board member is not entitled
21	to receive compensation but is entitled to reimbursement for actual
22	and necessary expenses.
23	Sec. 27.108. OFFICERS. (a) The board shall elect from the
24	board members a chair, a vice chair, a secretary, and any other
25	officer the board considers necessary, for a term of one year.
26	(b) A treasurer or any other officer a board considers
27	necessary is not required to be a board member. The officer may be

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1	appointed by the board for a term determined by the board.
2	(c) The offices of secretary and treasurer may be held by
3	the same person.
4	[Sections 27.109-27.150 reserved for expansion]
5	SUBCHAPTER D. POWERS AND DUTIES
6	Sec. 27.151. GENERAL POWERS. A district may:
7	(1) have succession by the district's corporate name
8	for the duration of time specified in the articles of
9	incorporation;
10	(2) sue and be sued in the district's own name in civil
11	suits and actions, except actions in tort against the district;
12	(3) adopt and make use of a corporate seal;
13	(4) adopt and alter bylaws for the regulation and
14	conduct of the district's affairs and business;
15	(5) acquire, receive, take, and hold, by purchase,
16	gift, lease, devise, or other means, property, regardless of
17	whether in one or more counties or within or outside the corporate
18	limits of an authorizing governmental entity, and manage the
19	property, including developing undeveloped property owned, leased,
20	or controlled by the district;
21	(6) execute a contract or other instrument;
22	(7) enter on land, water, and premises for the
23	purposes of making surveys, soundings, and examinations;
24	(8) plan, establish, develop, acquire, construct,
25	enlarge, improve, maintain, equip, operate, regulate, and protect
26	an airport and air navigation facility, including the:
27	(A) acquisition, construction, installation,

1	equipment, maintenance, and operation at, in connection with, or in
2	furtherance of the use at an airport of sanitary and storm sewage
3	systems and water, electric, and gas systems, buildings, hangars,
4	and other facilities for:
5	(i) airlines, United States military
6	aircraft, and general aviation aircraft; or
7	(ii) the comfort, use, and accommodation of
8	air travelers; and
9	(B) purchase and sale of supplies, goods, and
10	commodities incident to the operation of an airport property;
11	(9) construct, acquire, establish, improve, extend,
12	enlarge, reconstruct, equip, maintain, repair, and operate a
13	heliport, an aerial aircraft landing, loading, or storage area, and
14	a transportation terminal;
15	(10) construct, acquire, establish, improve, extend,
16	enlarge, reconstruct, equip, maintain, and repair a building,
17	structure, or facility that is suitable for use as a manufacturing
18	plant, industrial plant, retail shopping area, park, or exhibit, or
19	for the conduct of lawful business at, on, or adjacent to an airport
20	or aircraft landing area owned or operated by the district;
21	(11) lease a building, structure, or facility
22	described in Subdivision (10) to a tenant under terms approved by
23	the district;
24	(12) for compensation, furnish or supply on an airport
25	or aircraft landing area owned or operated by or under the
26	jurisdiction of the district, to persons and aircraft, goods,
27	commodities, area facilities, and services convenient or useful to

the owners, operators, and users of aircraft and to persons at the 1 airport or aircraft landing area, including food, lodging, shelter, 2 drinks, confections, reading matter, oil, gasoline, jet fuel, 3 motors, engines, aircraft, aircraft parts and equipment, space in 4 buildings, space for buildings and structures, and the services of 5 6 mechanics and instructors; 7 (13) confer on any person, for compensation, the privilege or concession of supplying on an airport or aircraft 8 landing area owned or operated by or under the jurisdiction of the 9 district, all of the items to be furnished or supplied under 10 11 Subdivision (12); (14) acquire, including by eminent domain, establish, 12 13 construct, expand, own, control, equip, improve, maintain, operate, and regulate a satellite airport or landing field for the 14 15 use of aircraft in the state; 16 (15) acquire, including by purchase, gift, devise, 17 lease, or eminent domain proceedings, an existing airport and air 18 navigation facility with the consent of the county, municipality, or other governmental entity of the state that owns or controls the 19 20 airport and air navigation facility; (16) issue interest-bearing bonds payable from the 21 22 limited sources available under this chapter; (17) pledge for payment of bonds any revenues and 23 funds from which the bonds are made payable; 24 (18) enter into a contract, lease, or other agreement 25 26 incidental to or necessary for the accomplishment of any purpose 27 for which the district was organized;

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1	(19) exercise the power of eminent domain with respect
2	to property, including airspace, air navigation easements,
3	structures, obstructions to flight, and property already devoted to
4	public use, that reasonably may be necessary for the construction,
5	extension, maintenance, operation, protection, enlargement,
6	improvement, or preservation of an airport or airport facility or
7	sanitary or storm sewage systems or water, electric, or gas systems
8	on, adjacent to, or in connection with or for the furtherance of the
9	use of an airport, aircraft landing area, or other property owned by
10	or operated by the district;
11	(20) appoint, employ, contract with, and compensate
12	officers, employees, and agents, including engineers, security
13	officers and guards, attorneys, consultants, fiscal advisers, and
14	other employees the district may require;
15	(21) fix, establish, collect, and alter landing fees,
16	tolls, rents, and other charges for the use of an airport, landing
17	area, building, structure, facility, or other property owned or
18	controlled by the district;
19	(22) adopt and enforce rules governing the use of an
20	airport, landing area, or airport facility owned or controlled by
21	the district;
22	(23) provide for insurance, including use and
23	occupancy insurance, as determined by the board;
24	(24) invest funds of the district that the board
25	determines are not presently needed for its corporate purposes in:
26	(A) a direct general obligation of the United
27	States;

(B) an obligation that is unconditionally 1 guaranteed as to both principal and interest by the United States; 2 3 or 4 (C) bonds of the state, a county, or a municipality; 5 6 (25) contract with the state, a county, a 7 municipality, a public corporation, an agency, a department, or another political subdivision of this state if the board determines 8 9 that the contract accomplishes the purposes for which the district 10 was established; 11 (26) sell and convey property that is obsolete, worn out, or no longer needed or useful; 12 13 (27) receive and accept for the construction, extension, improvement, maintenance, or operation of an airport or 14 airport facility money, property, labor, or other thing of value 15 16 from any source, including grants from the United States, the state, or any political subdivision of the state; 17 18 (28) purchase services, equipment, and supplies necessary or convenient for the exercise of any power of the 19 20 district; (29) enter into a management agreement with a county 21 22 or municipality for the management by the district of an airport, air navigation facility, or other facility useful to the district; 23 (30) require the relocation, removal, or other 24 25 adjustment of public utility facilities to accommodate a project of the district, only if the district reimburses the public utility 26 27 for the cost of the relocation, removal, or other adjustment,

	including the value of any easement or other associated property right; and
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3	(31) take any other action necessary or convenient to
4	carry out the purposes of this chapter or the exercise of a power
5	granted under this chapter.
6	Sec. 27.152. ACQUISITION OR OPERATION OF CERTAIN AIRPORTS.
7	A district may acquire or operate an airport located in the
8	district's jurisdiction that is not served by an air carrier
9	engaged in scheduled "interstate air commerce," as defined by 14
10	C.F.R. Section 1.1, on or before the effective date of the Act
11	enacting this chapter.
12	Sec. 27.153. ZONING. (a) A district is exempt from
13	municipal or county zoning laws, ordinances, and regulations.
14	(b) A district has the same zoning powers, for the zoning of
15	an airport in an unincorporated area owned or operated by the
16	district and the zoning of the unincorporated area lying within two
17	miles of the boundaries of the airport, as a municipality that owns
18	or operates an airport.
19	Sec. 27.154. LIMIT ON EMINENT DOMAIN POWER. A district may
20	not acquire by eminent domain real property or rights:
21	(1) owned or held by a railroad or utility; or
22	(2) under the management and control of the governing
23	body of an institution of higher education, as defined by Section
24	61.003, Education Code, including lands set aside and appropriated
25	to or acquired by the permanent university fund as provided by
26	Section 11, Article VII, Texas Constitution.
27	Sec. 27.155. MUNICIPAL VOTE REQUIRED FOR MUNICIPAL

1	AIRPORTS. Before a district may own, acquire, construct, or
2	operate an airport or an airport facility within the corporate
3	limits of a municipality, a majority of the governing body of the
4	municipality must vote in favor of the proposed airport or airport
5	facility.
6	Sec. 27.156. PEACE OFFICERS. The district may employ
7	security officers who have obtained a peace officer license issued
8	by the Commission on Law Enforcement Officer Standards and
9	Education.
10	[Sections 27.157-27.200 reserved for expansion]
11	SUBCHAPTER E. GENERAL FINANCIAL PROVISIONS; TAX EXEMPTIONS
12	Sec. 27.201. TAX EXEMPTION; BONDS, PROPERTY, INCOME.
13	(a) Bonds issued by a district and the income on the bonds are
14	exempt from all state taxation.
15	(b) All property and income of a district are exempt from
16	all state, county, municipal, and other local taxation.
17	(c) Subsection (b) does not exempt concessionaires,
18	licensees, tenants, operators, or lessees of a district from the
19	payment of any taxes, including licenses or privilege taxes imposed
20	by the state, a county, or a municipality.
21	Sec. 27.202. TAX EXEMPTION; ACCESS TO AIRPORTS. A county or
22	municipality may not require the payment of any tax or privilege
23	license from a person for the reasonable use of public streets,
24	roads, or highways leading to or from an airport or aircraft landing
25	area owned or operated by or under the jurisdiction of a district.
26	Sec. 27.203. FUNDING. (a) A district is authorized to
27	accept, receive, disburse, and expend federal money, state money,

and any other money made available by grant or loan to accomplish a 1 2 district purpose. 3 (b) Federal money accepted under this section shall be accepted and expended by a district on terms prescribed by the 4 United States that are not inconsistent with the laws of this state. 5 Sec. 27.204. TAX IMPLICATIONS. This subchapter does not 6 7 alter the taxability of any property that is taxable under the Tax Code on the effective date of the Act that enacted this chapter. 8 9 [Sections 27.205-27.250 reserved for expansion] SUBCHAPTER F. BONDS 10 Sec. 27.251. GENERAL PROVISIONS. (a) A district may issue 11 interest-bearing revenue bonds for any of the district's corporate 12 13 purposes. (b) The principal of and the interest on bonds is payable 14 15 solely from and may be secured by a pledge of the revenue derived by 16 a district from the operation of district airports, facilities, and 17 other property. 18 (c) Bonds issued or contracts entered into by a district under this chapter do not create debt of the state, a county, or a 19 20 municipality and do not create a charge against the credit or taxing powers of the state, a county, or a municipality. 21 22 Sec. 27.252. BONDS ISSUED. (a) Board proceedings shall determine how bonds are issued, including the following matters: 23 (1) whether the bonds are issued at any time and from 24 25 time to time; (2) bond form and denominations; 26 27 (3) bond tenor, payable in installments, and at times

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1	not to exceed 40 years from the date of issue;
2	(4) place of issue; and
3	(5) rate of interest.
4	(b) A bond having a stated maturity date more than 10 years
5	after its date of issue is subject to redemption at the option of a
6	district not later than the 10th anniversary of its date of issue
7	and on any interest payment date after that time at a price, after
8	notice, on terms, in the manner provided in the board proceeding
9	that authorized the bond issuance.
10	(c) Bonds of a district may be sold at public or private sale
11	in the manner and from time to time as may be determined by the
12	board.
13	(d) A district may pay all reasonable expenses, premiums,
14	fees, and commissions that the board determines are necessary or
15	advantageous in connection with the authorization, sale, and
16	issuance of bonds.
17	(e) Bonds must contain a recital that the bonds are issued
18	under this chapter.
19	(f) A public hearing is not required for the issuance of
20	bonds by a district.
21	(g) Bonds issued under this chapter are negotiable
22	instruments within the meaning of the negotiable instruments law of
23	this state if the bonds otherwise possess all the characteristics
24	of a negotiable instrument under the law of this state.
25	Sec. 27.253. NOTICE; CHALLENGES. (a) On the adoption of a
26	resolution providing for the issuance of bonds, a district may
27	publish, once a week for two consecutive weeks, in a newspaper that

1	is distributed in the county in which the principal office of the
2	district is located, notice in substantially the following form at
3	the end of which shall be printed the name and title of either the
4	chair or secretary of the district:
5	, a public corporation of the State of Texas,
6	on the day of authorized the issuance of
7	<u>\$</u> principal amount of revenue bonds of the
8	corporation for purposes authorized in the Act of the
9	Legislature of Texas under which the corporation was
10	organized. Any action or proceeding questioning the
11	validity of the bonds, or the pledge and any
12	instruments securing the bonds, or the proceedings
13	authorizing the bonds, must be commenced within 20
14	days after the first publication of this notice."
15	(b) An action or proceeding in a court to set aside or
16	question the proceedings for the issuance of bonds referred to in a

19	bonds must be commenced before the 31st day after the date of first
20	publication of the notice.
21	(c) After the 30-day period described under Subsection (b)
22	<u>expires:</u>
23	(1) a right of action or defense questioning or
24	attacking the validity of the proceedings, bonds, pledge, or
25	instruments may not be asserted; and
26	(2) the validity of the proceedings, bonds, pledge, or
27	instruments is not open to question in a court on any ground.

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1	Sec. 27.254. EXECUTION AND DELIVERY. (a) Bonds shall be
2	signed by the chair or vice chair and by the secretary or treasurer
3	of a district. The signature of one of the officers whose
4	signatures will appear on the bonds may be imprinted or otherwise
5	reproduced.
6	(b) The seal of a district must be affixed onto the bonds or
7	a facsimile of the seal of a district must be imprinted or otherwise
8	reproduced on the bonds.
9	(c) Coupons must be signed by the chair or vice chair and by
10	the secretary or treasurer of a district. The signature of the
11	secretary or treasurer may be imprinted or otherwise reproduced.
12	(d) Delivery of bonds executed as provided under this
13	section is valid regardless of any changes in officers or in the
14	district seal after the signing and sealing of the bonds.
15	Sec. 27.255. SECURITY. (a) At the discretion of a
16	district, bonds may be issued under and secured by an indenture
17	between the district and a trustee. A trustee may be a private
18	person or corporation, including a trust company or bank having
19	trust powers.
20	(b) In an indenture or resolution providing for the issuance
21	of bonds, the district may:
22	(1) pledge, for payment of the principal of and the
23	interest on bonds, district revenue;
24	(2) assign, as security for payment, a lease,
25	franchise, permit, or contract; and
26	(3) mortgage a property.
27	(c) A pledge of revenue is valid from the time it is made.

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1	Pledged revenue received after the pledge by a district immediately
2	becomes subject to the lien of the pledge without physical delivery
3	or further act. The lien of the pledge is binding against a party
4	having a claim of any kind against the district, regardless of
5	whether the party has actual notice of the lien, from the time a
6	statement is filed in the office of the county clerk of:
7	(1) the county in which the principal office of the
8	district is located; or
9	(2) a county in which any part of the property, the
10	revenue from which is pledged, is located.
11	(d) A statement under Subsection (c) must contain:
12	(1) the date on which a resolution authorizing the
13	issuance of bonds was adopted by a board;
14	(2) the principal amount of bonds issued;
15	(3) a brief description of the revenue pledged; and
16	(4) a brief description of property the revenue from
17	which is pledged.
18	(e) In an indenture or resolution pledging revenue from an
19	airport, building, or facility, a district may include provisions
20	customarily contained in instruments securing evidence of
21	indebtedness, including provisions relating to:
22	(1) the collection, segregation, and application of
23	rental or other revenue due or to become due to the district;
24	(2) the terms to be incorporated in a lease agreement
25	pertaining to district property;
26	(3) the maintenance and insurance of a building or
27	structure owned by the district;

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1	(4) the creation and maintenance of special funds from
2	revenue of the district;
3	(5) the rights and remedies available in the event of
4	default to the holder of the bonds or the trustee under the
5	indenture; and
6	(6) restricting the individual rights of action of the
7	holders of the bonds and coupons.
8	(f) If a district defaults in payment of the principal of or
9	interest on bonds or in an agreement included in an indenture
10	securing the bonds, a holder of the bonds or any of the coupons, or
11	the trustee under an indenture if authorized in the indenture:
12	(1) may enforce payment of the principal or interest
13	by civil action, mandamus, or other proceeding;
14	(2) may compel performance of a duty of the board and
15	officers of the district; and
16	(3) is as a matter of right and regardless of the
17	sufficiency of the security entitled to the appointment of a
18	receiver with all the powers of a receiver for the:
19	(A) operation and maintenance of the property of
20	the district covered by the indenture; and
21	(B) collection, segregation, and application of
22	revenue from property of the district covered by the indenture.
23	Sec. 27.256. PROCEEDS. (a) Proceeds derived from the sale
24	of bonds may be used only to pay the cost of acquiring,
25	constructing, improving, enlarging, and equipping an airport,
26	facility, or other property as specified in the proceedings in
27	which the bonds are authorized to be issued.

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1	(b) Eligible costs under Subsection (a) include:
2	(1) the cost of land forming a part of an airport,
3	facility, or other property;
4	(2) the cost of labor, material, and supplies used in
5	the construction, improvement, or enlargement, including
6	architects' and engineers' fees and the cost of preparing contract
7	documents and advertising for bids;
8	(3) the purchase price of and the cost of installing
9	equipment for the airport, facility, or other property;
10	(4) the cost of landscaping the lands forming a part of
11	an airport, facility, or property, and of constructing roads,
12	sidewalks, curbs, gutters, utilities, and parking places in
13	connection with an airport, facility, or other property;
14	(5) legal, fiscal, and recording fees and expenses
15	incurred in connection with the authorization, sale, and issuance
16	of bonds issued in connection with an airport, facility, or other
17	property; and
18	(6) interest on bonds issued in connection with an
19	airport, facility, or other property for a reasonable period before
20	and during the time required for the construction and equipment not
21	to exceed 18 months after the date of completion of the construction
22	and equipment.
23	(c) If any proceeds derived from the sale of bonds remain
24	undisbursed after completion of the work described under Subsection
25	(a) and payment of costs under Subsection (b), the proceeds shall be
26	used for retirement of the principal of the bonds of the same issue.
27	Sec. 27.257. REFUNDING BONDS. (a) A district may at any

1 time issue refunding bonds for the purpose of:

(1) refunding the principal of and interest on 2 3 outstanding bonds of the district regardless of whether the principal and interest have matured at the time of the refunding; 4 5 and 6 (2) paying the expenses incurred in connection with 7 the refunding and any premium necessary to be paid to redeem, retire, or purchase for retirement the bonds to be refunded. 8 9 (b) Proceeds derived from the sale of refunding bonds may be 10 used only for the purposes for which the refunding bonds were 11 authorized to be issued. (c) Refunding may be effected: 12 13 (1) by sale of the refunding bonds and the application 14 of the proceeds; or

15 (2) by exchange of the refunding bonds for the bonds or 16 interest coupons to be refunded, except that the holders of the 17 bonds or coupons to be refunded may not be compelled without their 18 consent to surrender their bonds or coupons for payment or exchange 19 before the date on which they may be paid or redeemed by call of the 20 district under their respective provisions.

(d) If a district issues bonds for the purpose of refunding the principal of and interest on any of its bonds or for any other purpose for which it is authorized to issue bonds, this section applies only to the portion of the combined issue authorized for refunding purposes, and the rest of this subchapter applies to the remaining portion of the combined issue.

27 Sec. 27.258. LOCAL GOVERNMENT INVESTMENT. A governing body

1	of a county or municipality may invest idle or surplus money held in
2	its treasury in district bonds.
3	Sec. 27.259. LEGAL INVESTMENTS. (a) Bonds issued under
4	this subchapter are legal investments for executors,
5	administrators, trustees, and other fiduciaries, unless otherwise
6	directed by the court having jurisdiction of the fiduciary relation
7	or by the document that is the source of the fiduciary's authority.
8	(b) Bonds issued under this subchapter are legal
9	investments for savings banks and insurance companies organized
10	under the laws of this state.

12	SUBCHAPTER G. WITHDRAWAL OR DISSOLUTION
13	Sec. 27.301. WITHDRAWAL FROM DISTRICT. (a) After the
14	organization of a district by more than one governmental entity,
15	the state, a county, or a municipality in a district may withdraw
16	from the district by resolution of the governor, the commissioners
17	court of the county, or the governing body of the municipality.
18	(b) A withdrawing entity may not claim or remove an asset of
19	the district.
20	Sec. 27.302. DISSOLUTION. (a) If a district does not have
21	outstanding bonds, the district may be dissolved on the filing of
22	articles of dissolution with the secretary of state by each member
23	of the district.
24	(b) On issue of a certificate of dissolution by the
25	secretary of state, a district dissolves. On dissolution, all
26	rights, titles, and interests of the district in property:
27	(1) vest in the authorizing governmental entities as

1 provided by the articles of incorporation; or

2 (2) if not provided for in the articles of 3 incorporation, vest in the authorizing governmental entities 4 equally.

5 SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect 6 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members 7 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas 8 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for 9 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
