1 AN ACT 2 relating to exemptions from the law governing emergency medical services for certain transfer vehicles and staff and to the minimum 3 4 qualifications for obtaining an emergency medical services provider license. 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 6 SECTION 1. Subsection (a), Section 773.004, Health and 7 Safety Code, is amended to read as follows: 8 This chapter does not apply to: 9 (a) (1) a ground transfer vehicle and staff used to 10 transport a patient who is under a physician's care between medical 11 facilities or between a medical facility and a private residence, 12 13 unless it is medically necessary to transport the patient using a 14 stretcher; [ground or] air transfer that does not advertise 15 (2) as an ambulance service and that is not licensed by the department; 16 the use of ground or air transfer vehicles to 17 (3) transport sick or injured persons in a casualty situation that 18 19 exceeds the basic vehicular capacity or capability of emergency medical services providers in the area; 20 (4) an industrial ambulance; or 21 22 (5) a physician, registered nurse, or other health 23 care practitioner licensed by this state unless the health care 24 practitioner staffs an emergency medical services vehicle

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2 SECTION 2. Section 773.042, Health and Safety Code, is 3 amended to read as follows:

Sec. 773.042. BASIC LIFE-SUPPORT 4 EMERGENCY MEDICAL 5 SERVICES PROVIDER QUALIFICATIONS. A provider qualifies as a basic 6 life-support emergency medical services provider if it provides a 7 vehicle that is designed for transporting the sick or injured, [and] has personnel and sufficient equipment and supplies for 8 9 providing basic life support, and is capable of providing emergency and nonemergency transportation. 10

SECTION 3. Section 773.057, Health and Safety Code, is amended by adding Subsection (e) to read as follows:

13 (e) In addition to any other qualifications that an 14 emergency medical services provider must possess to obtain the type 15 of license sought, all emergency medical services providers must 16 possess the qualifications required for a basic emergency medical 17 services provider under Section 773.042.

SECTION 4. (a) A person or vehicle that becomes subject to Chapter 773, Health and Safety Code, and rules adopted under that law as a result of the changes in law made by this Act is not required to comply with Chapter 773 and applicable rules before June 1, 2006.

(b) A person who is a licensed emergency medical services provider immediately before the effective date of this Act must meet the requirements of Section 773.042, Health and Safety Code, as amended by this Act, on renewing the license.

27 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
