A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to making supplemental appropriations and reductions in

- 3 appropriations.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. AUSTIN COMMUNITY COLLEGE: GROUP HEALTH
- 6 INSURANCE. In addition to amounts previously appropriated for the
- 7 state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2007, the amount of
- 8 \$3,678,942 is appropriated out of the general revenue fund to
- 9 Austin Community College for the two-year period beginning on the
- 10 effective date of this Act for the purpose of correcting the
- 11 institution's underreporting of its state-funded group health
- insurance enrollment for fiscal years 2006 and 2007.
- 13 SECTION 2. SOUTH PLAINS COLLEGE: GROUP HEALTH INSURANCE.
- 14 In addition to amounts previously appropriated for the state fiscal
- 15 biennium ending August 31, 2007, the amount of \$1,424,764 is
- 16 appropriated out of the general revenue fund to South Plains
- 17 College for the two-year period beginning on the effective date of
- 18 this Act for the purpose of correcting the institution's
- 19 underreporting of its state-funded group health insurance
- 20 enrollment for fiscal years 2006 and 2007.
- 21 SECTION 3. TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE:
- 22 OPERATIONS. In addition to amounts previously appropriated for the
- 23 state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2007, the amount of
- \$47,000,000 is appropriated out of the general revenue fund to the

- 1 Texas Department of Criminal Justice for the two-year period
- 2 beginning on the effective date of this Act for the purpose of
- 3 providing for salaries and wages, hazardous duty and longevity pay,
- 4 overtime pay, contractual rate adjustments, utilities, and fuel.
- 5 SECTION 4. TEXAS MEDICAL BOARD: OPERATIONS. In addition to
- 6 amounts previously appropriated for the state fiscal biennium
- 7 ending August 31, 2007, the amount of \$1,007,827 is appropriated
- 8 out of the general revenue fund to the Texas Medical Board for the
- 9 two-year period beginning on the effective date of this Act for the
- 10 purpose of:
- 11 (1) repaying the Governor's Emergency and Deficiency
- 12 Grant awarded in fiscal year 2006; and
- 13 (2) providing for agency operating expenses for
- 14 licensing and enforcement.
- 15 SECTION 5. TEXAS BUILDING AND PROCUREMENT COMMISSION:
- 16 MAINTENANCE. In addition to amounts previously appropriated for
- 17 the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2007, the amount of
- 18 \$64,013,000 is appropriated out of the general revenue fund to the
- 19 Texas Building and Procurement Commission for the two-year period
- 20 beginning on the effective date of this Act for the purpose of
- 21 providing for various life safety and deferred maintenance
- 22 projects.
- 23 SECTION 6. TEXAS BUILDING AND PROCUREMENT COMMISSION:
- 24 ABATEMENT OF ASBESTOS AND BUILD-OUT OF STEPHEN F. AUSTIN BUILDING.
- 25 In addition to amounts previously appropriated for the state fiscal
- 26 biennium ending August 31, 2007, the amount of \$12,014,700 is
- 27 appropriated out of the general revenue fund to the Texas Building

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- 1 and Procurement Commission for the two-year period beginning on the
- 2 effective date of this Act for the purpose of the abatement of
- 3 asbestos and the build-out of the Stephen F. Austin Building.
- 4 SECTION 7. HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES COMMISSION: MEDICARE
- 5 PART D GIVEBACK. (a) An amount not to exceed \$111,100,000 is
- 6 appropriated out of the general revenue fund to the Health and Human
- 7 Services Commission for the state fiscal year ending August 31,
- 8 2007, for the purpose of repaying the federal government the
- 9 amounts determined by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services
- 10 to be due in accordance with the phased-down state contribution for
- 11 full dual-eligible persons as required by the Medicare Prescription
- 12 Drug, Improvement, and Modernization Act of 2003, Pub. L. No.
- 13 108-173, 117 Stat. 2066.
- 14 (b) If any money appropriated by this section and paid to
- 15 the federal government is subsequently returned by the federal
- 16 government to the Health and Human Services Commission or to
- 17 another state agency or office as a result of litigation,
- 18 reimbursement, or other federal assistance:
- 19 (1) the state agency or office receiving the money
- 20 shall report the return of the money to the Legislative Budget Board
- 21 and inform the board of the circumstances of its return; and
- 22 (2) the money may not be spent without the prior
- 23 approval of the Legislative Budget Board.
- 24 SECTION 8. REDUCTION IN VETOED FUNDS APPROPRIATION. The
- 25 appropriations made from general revenue by Section 13.18, Article
- 26 IX, Chapter 1369, Acts of the 79th Legislature, Regular Session,
- 27 2005 (the General Appropriations Act), are reduced by an amount

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- 1 equal to the cumulative amount of appropriations made by this Act.
- 2 SECTION 9. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
- 3 immediately.
