A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

Τ	AN ACT
2	relating to the eligibility of an individual born in this state
3	whose parents are illegal aliens to receive state benefits.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Title 10, Government Code, is amended by adding
6	Subtitle H to read as follows:
7	SUBTITLE H. PROVISION OF PUBLIC BENEFITS
8	CHAPTER 2352. ELIGIBILITY FOR BENEFITS
9	Sec. 2352.001. DEFINITION. In this chapter, "illegal
10	alien" means an individual who is not a citizen or national of the
11	United States and who has entered the United States without
12	inspection and authorization by an immigration officer.
13	Sec. 2352.002. APPLICABILITY. This chapter applies only to
14	an individual:
15	(1) who is born in this state on or after the effective
16	date of this chapter; and
17	(2) whose parents are illegal aliens at the time the
18	individual is born.
19	Sec. 2352.003. ELIGIBILITY. An individual to whom this
20	chapter applies is not entitled to and may not receive any benefit
21	provided by this state or a political subdivision of this state,
22	<pre>including:</pre>
23	(1) a grant, contract, loan, professional license, or

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commercial license provided by an agency of this state or a

1	political subdivision of this state or by appropriated funds of
2	this state or a political subdivision of this state;
3	(2) employment by this state or a political
4	subdivision of this state;
5	(3) a retirement payment or other benefit received on
6	account of the status of the individual as a former employee or
7	officer of this state or a political subdivision of this state;
8	(4) public assistance benefits, including welfare
9	payments, food stamps, or food assistance from this state or a
10	political subdivision of this state;
11	(5) health care or public assistance health benefits;
12	(6) disability benefits or assistance;
13	(7) public housing or public housing assistance;
14	(8) instruction in primary or secondary education;
15	(9) instruction from a public institution of higher
16	education; and
17	(10) an unemployment benefit.
18	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
19	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
20	provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
21	Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
22	Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
