1 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only 2 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is 3 4 covered by the law in effect when the offense was committed, and the 5 former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of this section, an offense is committed before the effective date of 6 this Act if any element of the offense occurs before that date. 7 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007. 8
