A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to an optometry career program at the University of
3	Houston.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 111, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 111.43 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 111.43. OPTOMETRY CAREER PROGRAM. (a) The college of
8	optometry at the university may operate a summer program that
9	prepares highly qualified, economically and academically
10	disadvantaged junior-level, senior-level, and postbaccalaureate
11	students from any public or private institution of higher education
12	for advanced studies and a career in the field of optometry. The
13	program may include:
14	(1) courses in improvement of study skills and
15	Optometry Admission Test preparation courses;
16	(2) a review of selected undergraduate academic
17	courses that are prerequisites for admission to advanced degree
18	programs in optometry;
19	(3) academic courses that are designed to familiarize
20	students with the course work in advanced degree programs in
21	<pre>optometry;</pre>
22	(4) clinical work; and
23	(5) extracurricular activities, including observing
24	professionals working in the field of optometry.

1	(b) To the extent practicable, and consistent with the
2	purposes of the program, the college of optometry shall operate the
3	program in a manner designed to assist students to obtain course
4	credit for the program from their respective institutions of higher
5	education.
6	(c) The college of optometry shall:
7	(1) recruit eligible undergraduate or
8	postbaccalaureate students for admission to the program;
9	(2) establish an application process for admitting
10	eligible undergraduate or postbaccalaureate students to the
11	program;
12	(3) develop reasonable requirements for admission to
13	the program;
14	(4) monitor the implementation of the program; and
15	(5) assist in developing services, including career
16	counseling, to support and encourage the pursuit of advanced
17	studies and careers in the field of optometry.
18	(d) The college of optometry may solicit and accept gifts
19	and grants from any public or private source for the purposes of
20	this section. The legislature may appropriate money for the
21	purposes of this section.
22	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
23	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
24	provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
25	Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
26	Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
