- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 812.201, Government Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (d) to read as
- 7 follows:
- 8 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (c) or (d), a retiree
- 9 may not rejoin the retirement system as a member of the class from
- 10 which the person retired.
- 11 (d) A person who retired from the employee class of
- 12 membership with more than 14 years of service credit and who, after
- 13 retirement, resumed employment with a house of the legislature, not
- 14 as an employee of an individual member, is entitled, on request to
- 15 the retirement system, to resume membership in that class and
- 16 receive service credit for the period served in that position after
- 17 retirement. To receive the credit, the person is required to pay
- 18 <u>employee contributions, without interest, for the period of service</u>
- 19 after retirement. The contributions may be deducted from the
- 20 person's annuity as recalculated under this subsection. This
- 21 subsection does not apply to a person whose post-retirement service
- 22 extends after January 1, 2007.
- 23 SECTION 2. (a) A member of the Employees Retirement System
- of Texas who is an appointed or elected officer of the Senate of the

- 1 80th Legislature of the State of Texas, as determined by the Senate
- 2 Journal, who has at least 20 years of service credit in the
- 3 retirement system, may transfer the person's service credit to the
- 4 elected class. A person who makes a transfer under this provision
- 5 may continue to transfer the credit between classes before or after
- 6 retirement.
- 7 (b) A member of the Employees Retirement System of Texas who
- 8 is an appointed or elected officer of the House of Representatives
- 9 of the 80th Legislature of the State of Texas, as determined by the
- 10 House Journal, and who has also served on the staff of a state
- 11 judicial agency, and who has at least 15 years of service credit in
- 12 the retirement system, may transfer the person's service credit to
- 13 the elected class. A person who makes a transfer under this
- 14 provision may continue to transfer the credit between classes
- 15 before or after retirement.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 17 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 18 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 19 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 20 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
