The change in law made by this Act applies only to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. 19 For purposes of this section, an offense is committed before the 20 21 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurs before the effective date. An offense committed before the 22 23 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect when the offense was committed, and the former law is continued in effect for 24
