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## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to programs to increase the availability of fresh produce
3	to, and the purchase and consumption of fresh produce by, certain
4	low-income individuals.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Title 2, Agriculture Code, is amended by adding
7	Chapters 23 and 24 to read as follows:
8	CHAPTER 23. SMALL RETAILERS COMPETITIVE GRANT PILOT PROGRAM
9	Sec. 23.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
10	(1) "Fresh produce" means fresh fruits and vegetables.
11	(2) "Program" means the small retailers competitive
12	grant pilot program established under this chapter.
13	(3) "Rural county" has the meaning assigned by Section
14	487.701, Government Code, as added by Chapter 712 (H.B. 2235), Acts
15	of the 80th Legislature, Regular Session, 2007.
16	Sec. 23.002. ESTABLISHMENT OF SMALL RETAILERS COMPETITIVE
17	GRANT PILOT PROGRAM. (a) Subject to available funding, the
18	department shall develop and implement a small retailers
19	competitive grant pilot program through which the department will
20	award grants to small retailers in certain low-income communities
21	in this state to increase the access to fresh produce by individuals

(b) The department by rule shall define "small retailer" for

- 1 (c) The department shall select at least two urban and at
- 2 least two rural counties in which to operate the program. To be
- 3 selected, a county must:
- 4 (1) have at least 75,000 residents who have net family
- 5 incomes below 100 percent of the federal poverty level; or
- 6 (2) have a poverty rate above the statewide average.
- 7 Sec. 23.003. ADVERTISEMENT. Before issuing a request for
- 8 proposals or awarding a grant under this chapter, the department
- 9 shall advertise the program by:
- 10 (1) posting information about the program on the
- 11 department's Internet website; and
- 12 (2) as the department determines appropriate,
- 13 distributing information about the program to food retailer
- 14 associations, fresh produce associations, chambers of commerce,
- 15 and other membership organizations with members that are small
- 16 retailers.
- Sec. 23.004. ELIGIBILITY. (a) A small retailer is eligible
- 18 to apply for a grant under the program if:
- 19 (1) the small retailer's place of business is located
- 20 within a county in which the department operates the program;
- 21 (2) there is no other retailer of fresh produce within
- 22 a one-mile radius of the small retailer's place of business on the
- 23 date of the application; and
- 24 (3) each owner of the small retailer who is a natural
- 25 person is a United States citizen or legal resident of the United
- 26 States.
- 27 (b) In determining eligibility under Subsection (a)(3) the

- 1 department is not authorized to enforce federal immigration laws.
- 2 Sec. 23.005. USE OF AWARDED GRANT MONEY. A grant recipient
- 3 may use grant money awarded under the program only to cover costs
- 4 that are approved by the department, which may include costs
- 5 related to:
- 6 (1) training employees regarding the proper storage of
- 7 <u>fresh produce;</u>
- 8 (2) training employees regarding the marketing of
- 9 fresh produce;
- 10 (3) obtaining marketing materials, including signage
- 11 and flyers;
- 12 (4) obtaining refrigeration units for the storage of
- 13 fresh produce; and
- 14 (5) obtaining technical assistance regarding
- 15 refrigeration units and other equipment required to store fresh
- 16 produce.
- 17 Sec. 23.006. GRANT RECIPIENT REPORTING REQUIREMENTS. A
- 18 grant recipient shall report information related to the program to
- 19 the department in the form and manner and at regular intervals as
- 20 prescribed by the department. Each report must include the
- 21 following information for the period covered by the report:
- 22 (1) the amount of fresh produce that was added to the
- 23 <u>recipient's inventory as a result of the grant;</u>
- 24 (2) the amount of monthly gross receipts earned from
- 25 the sale of fresh produce; and
- 26 (3) a detailed accounting of how the grant money was
- 27 spent.

- 1 Sec. 23.007. EVALUATION BY DEPARTMENT. The department
- 2 shall monitor and periodically evaluate:
- 3 (1) the performance of each grant recipient under the
- 4 program;
- 5 (2) how each grant recipient uses the grant money
- 6 awarded under the program; and
- 7 (3) the effect of the program on the ability of the
- 8 grant recipient to include fresh produce in the grant recipient's
- 9 inventory.
- Sec. 23.008. FUNDING. (a) The department shall seek and
- 11 apply for any available federal funding, including federal matching
- 12 funds, to assist with financing the program.
- 13 (b) The department may solicit and accept grants, gifts, and
- 14 donations from any public or private source for the purposes of this
- 15 <u>chapter.</u>
- Sec. 23.009. REPORT TO LEGISLATURE. Not later than
- 17 December 1, 2010, the <u>department shall submit an initial report to</u>
- 18 the legislature that includes:
- 19 (1) an evaluation of the performance and operation of
- 20 the program; and
- 21 (2) recommendations on the continuation, elimination,
- 22 or expansion of the program.
- Sec. 23.010. EXPIRATION. This chapter expires September 1,
- 24 2011.
- 25 CHAPTER 24. FARMERS' MARKET NUTRITION PROGRAM FOR SENIORS
- Sec. 24.001. DEFINITION. In this chapter, "program" means
- 27 the farmers' market nutrition program for seniors established under

- 1 this chapter.
- 2 Sec. 24.002. ESTABLISHMENT OF FARMERS' MARKET NUTRITION
- 3 PROGRAM FOR SENIORS. Subject to available federal funding, the
- 4 department shall establish and implement a farmers' market
- 5 nutrition program for seniors in accordance with 7 U.S.C. Section
- 6 3007 to provide low-income persons who are 60 years of age or older
- 7 with fresh fruits, vegetables, and herbs through farmers' markets
- 8 and other local venues.
- 9 Sec. 24.003. FUNDING. The department shall seek and apply
- 10 for any available federal funding to finance the program.
- 11 Sec. 24.004. RULES. The department shall adopt rules
- 12 necessary to implement the program.
- SECTION 2. If funding is available, not later than January
- 14 1, 2010, the Department of Agriculture shall implement the small
- 15 retailers competitive grant pilot program established under
- 16 Chapter 23, Agriculture Code, as added by this Act.
- 17 SECTION 3. As soon as practicable after the completion of
- 18 the small retailers competitive grant pilot program implemented
- 19 under Chapter 23, Agriculture Code, as added by this Act, but not
- 20 later than November 1, 2011, if that program is implemented, the
- 21 Department of Agriculture shall submit a final report to the
- 22 legislature that includes an overall evaluation of the performance
- 23 and operation of the program.
- SECTION 4. As soon as practicable, the Department of
- 25 Agriculture shall apply for and actively pursue federal funding to
- 26 implement the farmers' market nutrition program for seniors
- 27 established under Chapter 24, Agriculture Code, as added by this

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- 1 Act. The department shall delay implementing the program until the
- 2 federal funding applied for under this section is granted.
- 3 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
