16	(a) A person who violates <u>Section 501.101</u> [ <del>this subchapter</del> ]
17	is liable to this state for a civil penalty in an amount not to
18	exceed \$500 for each violation. The attorney general or the
19	prosecuting attorney in the county in which the violation occurs
20	may bring an action to recover the civil penalty imposed under this
21	subsection [section].
22	(a-1) A person who violates Section 501.1011 is liable to
23	this state for a civil penalty in an amount not to exceed \$500 for
24	each calendar month in which a violation occurs. The civil penalty
