- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 562.101(d), Occupations Code, is amended
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 (d) A Class C pharmacy that is in an institution with 100
- 8 beds or fewer is required to have the services of a pharmacist on a
- 9 part-time or consulting basis according to the needs of the
- 10 institution, except as provided by Section 562.1011.
- 11 SECTION 2. Subchapter C, Chapter 562, Occupations Code, is
- 12 amended by adding Section 562.1011 to read as follows:
- 13 Sec. 562.1011. SUPERVISION OF CLASS C PHARMACY IN CERTAIN
- 14 RURAL HOSPITALS. (a) In this section, "rural hospital" means a
- 15 <u>licensed</u> hospital with 100 beds or fewer that:
- 16 (1) is located in a county with a population of 50,000
- 17 or less; or
- 18 (2) has been designated by the Centers for Medicare
- 19 <u>and Medicaid Services as a critical access hospital, rural referral</u>
- 20 center, or sole community hospital.
- 21 (b) The board shall adopt rules to certify a pharmacy
- 22 <u>technician who applies under this section</u>. The board shall require
- 23 a pharmacy technician to pass an examination approved by the board
- 24 to qualify for the certification.

- 1 (c) The board by rule shall establish training standards for
  2 certified pharmacy technicians for the use of an automated
  3 medication supply system. A certified pharmacy technician must
  4 have proper training on the use of the system and demonstrate
  5 comprehensive knowledge of the written policies and procedures for
  6 operating the system before having access to the system.
- 7 (d) At the request of a rural hospital, the board shall 8 authorize the hospital to allow a pharmacy technician who is 9 certified under this section and employed by the hospital to 10 perform the duties described by Subsection (e) if the hospital:
- 11 (1) has entered into a contract with a pharmacist to be
  12 present at the hospital at least once a week; and
- (2) can communicate at all times with a pharmacist to

  14 clarify a medication order, drug interaction, drug allergy, or

  15 dosing instruction.
- (e) A certified pharmacy technician employed by an
  authorized rural hospital may enter a medication order in a patient
  profile or pharmacy system subject to documented verification by a
  licensed nurse or remote order review by a pharmacist. The pharmacy
  technician may, without electronic or direct supervision by a
  pharmacist, but subject to documented verification by a licensed
  nurse:
- 23 (1) fill a medication cart used in the hospital;
- 24 (2) replace medication to a manual floor stock system;
- 25 (3) prepare, package, or label a prescription drug
- 26 under a medication order;
- 27 (4) distribute a routine order for stock supplies to a

## 1 patient care area; and

- 2 (5) access an automated medication supply system.
- 3 SECTION 3. The Texas State Board of Pharmacy shall adopt the
- 4 rules required by Section 562.1011, Occupations Code, as added by
- 5 this Act, not later than December 1, 2009.
- 6 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
