H.B. No. 1982

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the regulation of dangerous and vicious dogs; providing
- 3 penalties.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 822.001(3), Health and Safety Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (3) "Dangerous dog," "dog," "owner," [and] "secure
- 8 enclosure," <u>and "vicious dog"</u> have the meanings assigned by Section
- 9 822.041.
- 10 SECTION 2. Section 822.003(f), Health and Safety Code, is
- 11 amended to read as follows:
- 12 (f) The court may not order the dog destroyed if the court
- 13 finds that the dog caused the serious bodily injury to a person by
- 14 attacking, biting, or mauling the person and:
- 15 (1) the dog was being used for the protection of a
- 16 person or person's property, the attack, bite, or mauling occurred
- 17 in an enclosure in which the dog was being kept, and:
- 18 (A) the enclosure was reasonably certain to
- 19 prevent the dog from leaving the enclosure on its own and provided
- 20 notice of the presence of a dog; and
- 21 (B) the injured person was at least <u>15</u> [eight]
- 22 years of age, and was trespassing in the enclosure when the attack,
- 23 bite, or mauling occurred;
- 24 (2) the dog was not being used for the protection of a

- 1 person or person's property, the attack, bite, or mauling occurred
- 2 in an enclosure in which the dog was being kept, and the injured
- 3 person was at least 15 [eight] years of age and was trespassing in
- 4 the enclosure when the attack, bite, or mauling occurred;
- 5 (3) the attack, bite, or mauling occurred during an
- 6 arrest or other action of a peace officer while the peace officer
- 7 was using the dog for law enforcement purposes;
- 8 (4) the dog was defending a person from an assault or
- 9 person's property from damage or theft by the injured person; or
- 10 (5) the injured person was younger than <u>15</u> [eight]
- 11 years of age, the attack, bite, or mauling occurred in an enclosure
- 12 in which the dog was being kept, and the enclosure was reasonably
- 13 certain to keep a person younger than 15 [eight] years of age from
- 14 entering.
- 15 SECTION 3. Sections 822.005, Health and Safety Code, is
- 16 amended by amending Subsections (a) and (b) and adding Subsection
- 17 (b-1) to read as follows:
- 18 (a) A person commits an offense if the person is the owner of
- 19 a dog and the person:
- 20 (1) with criminal negligence, as defined by Section
- 21 6.03, Penal Code, fails to secure the dog and the dog makes an
- 22 unprovoked attack on another person that occurs at a location other
- 23 than the owner's real property or in or on the owner's motor vehicle
- 24 or boat and that causes serious bodily injury, as defined by Section
- 25 1.07, Penal Code, or death to the other person; or
- 26 (2) knows the dog is a dangerous dog by learning in a
- 27 manner described by Section 822.042(g) that the person is the owner

- 1 of a dangerous dog, or knows the dog is a vicious dog, and the
- 2 dangerous or vicious dog makes an unprovoked attack on another
- 3 person that occurs at a location other than a secure enclosure in
- 4 which the dog is restrained in accordance with Subchapter D and that
- 5 causes serious bodily injury, as defined by Section 822.001, or
- 6 death to the other person.
- 7 (b) An offense under this section is a felony of the third
- 8 degree [unless the attack causes death, in which event the offense
- 9 is a felony of the second degree].
- 10 (b-1) Notwithstanding Subsection (b), an offense under this
- 11 section is a felony of the second degree if:
- 12 (1) the attack causes death;
- 13 (2) the victim of the attack is a person younger than
- 14 15 years of age; or
- 15 (3) the victim of the attack is a person 65 years of
- 16 age or older.
- 17 SECTION 4. The heading to Subchapter D, Chapter 822, Health
- 18 and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 19 SUBCHAPTER D. DANGEROUS AND VICIOUS DOGS
- SECTION 5. Section 822.041, Health and Safety Code, is
- 21 amended by adding Subdivision (6) to read as follows:
- 22 (6) "Vicious dog" means a dog that:
- (A) because of the dog's physical nature and
- 24 vicious propensity is capable of inflicting serious bodily injury,
- 25 as that term is defined by Section 822.001, or death to human beings
- 26 and constitutes a danger to human life or property;
- 27 <u>(B) without reasonable provocation has</u>

- 1 habitually behaved within the enclosure in which the dog is kept in
- 2 such a manner that the owner knows or should know that the animal is
- 3 likely to attack or bite;
- 4 (C) commits unprovoked acts while in the
- 5 enclosure in which the dog is kept, and those acts cause a person to
- 6 reasonably believe that the dog will attack and cause bodily injury
- 7 to that person; or
- 8 (D) acts in a highly aggressive manner while in
- 9 the enclosure in which the dog is kept and appears to a reasonable
- 10 person to be able to escape from the enclosure.
- 11 SECTION 6. The heading to Section 822.042, Health and
- 12 Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 13 Sec. 822.042. REQUIREMENTS FOR OWNER OF DANGEROUS OR
- 14 VICIOUS DOG.
- 15 SECTION 7. Section 822.042, Health and Safety Code, is
- 16 amended by amending Subsections (a), (b), (c), and (g) and adding
- 17 Subsections (h) and (i) to read as follows:
- 18 (a) Not later than the 30th day after a person learns that
- 19 the person is the owner of a dangerous or vicious dog, the person
- 20 shall:
- 21 (1) register the dangerous or vicious dog with the
- 22 animal control authority for the area in which the dog is kept;
- 23 (2) restrain the dangerous <u>or vicious</u> dog at all times
- 24 on a leash in the immediate control of a person or in a secure
- 25 enclosure;
- 26 (3) obtain liability insurance coverage or show
- 27 financial responsibility in an amount of at least \$100,000 to cover

- 1 damages resulting from an attack by the dangerous or vicious dog
- 2 causing bodily injury to a person and provide proof of the required
- 3 liability insurance coverage or financial responsibility to the
- 4 animal control authority for the area in which the dog is kept; and
- 5 (4) comply with an applicable municipal or county
- 6 regulation, requirement, or restriction on dangerous <u>or vicious</u>
- 7 dogs.
- 8 (b) The owner of a dangerous or vicious dog who does not
- 9 comply with Subsection (a) shall deliver the dog to the animal
- 10 control authority not later than the 30th day after the owner learns
- 11 that the dog is a dangerous or vicious dog.
- 12 (c) If, on application of any person, a justice court,
- 13 county court, or municipal court finds, after notice and hearing as
- 14 provided by Section 822.0423, that the owner of a dangerous $\underline{\text{or}}$
- 15 <u>vicious</u> dog has failed to comply with Subsection (a) or (b), the
- 16 court shall order the animal control authority to seize the dog and
- 17 shall issue a warrant authorizing the seizure. The authority shall
- 18 seize the dog or order its seizure and shall provide for the
- 19 impoundment of the dog in secure and humane conditions.
- 20 (g) For purposes of this section, a person learns that the
- 21 person is the owner of a dangerous or vicious dog when:
- 22 (1) the owner knows of an attack described in Section
- 23 822.041(2)(A) or (B);
- 24 (2) the owner receives notice that a justice court,
- 25 county court, or municipal court has found that the dog is a
- 26 dangerous or vicious dog under Section 822.0423; [or]
- 27 (3) the owner is informed by the animal control

- 1 authority that the dog is a dangerous or vicious dog under Section
- 2 822.0421; or
- 3 (4) the owner knows of or observes facts or actions
- 4 described by Section 822.041(6).
- 5 (h) A person who is younger than 21 years of age may not be
- 6 the owner of a dangerous or vicious dog.
- 7 (i) An owner of a dangerous or vicious dog may not allow the
- 8 dog to enter a public park or the grounds of a primary or secondary
- 9 school, regardless of whether the dog is on a leash.
- 10 SECTION 8. Section 822.0421, Health and Safety Code, is
- 11 amended to read as follows:
- 12 Sec. 822.0421. DETERMINATION THAT DOG IS DANGEROUS OR
- 13 VICIOUS. (a) If a person reports an incident described by Section
- 14 822.041(2) or a fact or action described by Section 822.041(6), the
- 15 animal control authority may investigate the <u>fact</u>, action, or
- 16 incident. If, after receiving the sworn statements of any
- 17 witnesses, the animal control authority determines the dog is a
- 18 dangerous or vicious dog, it shall notify the owner of that fact.
- 19 (b) An owner, not later than the 15th day after the date the
- 20 owner is notified that a dog owned by the owner is a dangerous $\underline{\text{or}}$
- 21 <u>vicious</u> dog, may appeal the determination of the animal control
- 22 authority to a justice, county, or municipal court of competent
- 23 jurisdiction. An owner may appeal the decision of the justice,
- 24 county, or municipal court in the same manner as appeal for other
- 25 cases from the justice, county, or municipal court.
- 26 SECTION 9. Sections 822.0422(b), (d), and (e), Health and
- 27 Safety Code, are amended to read as follows:

- 1 (b) A person may report an incident described by Section
- 2 822.041(2) or a fact or action described by Section 822.041(6) to a
- 3 municipal court, a justice court, or a county court. The owner of
- 4 the dog shall deliver the dog to the animal control authority not
- 5 later than the fifth day after the date on which the owner receives
- 6 notice that the report has been filed. The authority may provide
- 7 for the impoundment of the dog in secure and humane conditions until
- 8 the court orders the disposition of the dog.
- 9 (d) The court shall determine, after notice and hearing as
- 10 provided in Section 822.0423, whether the dog is a dangerous $\underline{\text{or}}$
- 11 vicious dog.
- 12 (e) The court, after determining that the dog is a dangerous
- 13 or vicious dog, may order the animal control authority to continue
- 14 to impound the dangerous or vicious dog in secure and humane
- 15 conditions until the court orders disposition of the dog under
- 16 Section 822.042 and the dog is returned to the owner or destroyed.
- SECTION 10. Section 822.0423(a), Health and Safety Code, is
- 18 amended to read as follows:
- 19 (a) The court, on receiving a report of an incident, fact,
- 20 or action under Section 822.0422 or on application under Section
- 21 822.042(c), shall set a time for a hearing to determine whether the
- 22 dog is a dangerous or vicious dog or whether the owner of the dog has
- 23 complied with Section 822.042. The hearing must be held not later
- 24 than the 10th day after the date on which the dog is seized or
- 25 delivered.
- SECTION 11. Subchapter D, Chapter 822, Health and Safety
- 27 Code, is amended by adding Section 822.0424 to read as follows:

- 1 Sec. 822.0424. RESPONSIBILITY OF DOG OWNER IN CERTAIN
- 2 MUNICIPALITIES. (a) This section applies only to a city with a
- 3 population of more than one million.
- 4 (b) A person who owns or keeps custody or control of a dog
- 5 weighing 40 pounds or more shall ensure that the dog, at any time
- 6 the dog is not on a leash in the immediate control of a person, is
- 7 kept inside a residence or in a secure enclosure on the premises
- 8 where the dog is kept.
- 9 SECTION 12. Section 822.043, Health and Safety Code, is
- 10 amended to read as follows:
- 11 Sec. 822.043. REGISTRATION. (a) An animal control
- 12 authority for the area in which the dog is kept shall annually
- 13 register a dangerous or vicious dog if the owner:
- 14 (1) presents proof of:
- 15 (A) liability insurance or financial
- 16 responsibility, as required by Section 822.042;
- 17 (B) current rabies vaccination of the dangerous
- 18 or vicious dog; and
- 19 (C) the secure enclosure in which the dangerous
- 20 or vicious dog will be kept; and
- 21 (2) pays an annual registration fee of \$50.
- 22 (b) The animal control authority shall provide to the owner
- 23 registering a dangerous or vicious dog a registration tag. The
- 24 owner must place the tag on the dog's collar.
- 25 (c) If an owner of a registered dangerous or vicious dog
- 26 sells or moves the dog to a new address, the owner, not later than
- 27 the 14th day after the date of the sale or move, shall notify the

- 1 animal control authority for the area in which the new address is
- 2 located. On presentation by the current owner of the dangerous or
- 3 vicious dog's prior registration tag and payment of a fee of \$25,
- 4 the animal control authority shall issue a new registration tag to
- 5 be placed on the dangerous or vicious dog's collar.
- 6 (d) An owner of a registered dangerous or vicious dog shall
- 7 notify the office in which the dangerous or vicious dog was
- 8 registered of any attacks the dangerous or vicious dog makes on
- 9 people.
- 10 SECTION 13. The heading to Section 822.044, Health and
- 11 Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 12 Sec. 822.044. ATTACK BY DANGEROUS OR VICIOUS DOG.
- SECTION 14. Sections 822.044(a) and (c), Health and Safety
- 14 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 15 (a) A person commits an offense if the person is the owner of
- 16 a dangerous or vicious dog and the dog makes an unprovoked attack on
- 17 another person outside the dog's enclosure and causes bodily injury
- 18 to the other person.
- 19 (c) If a person is found guilty of an offense under this
- 20 section, the court may order the dangerous or vicious dog destroyed
- 21 by a person listed in Section 822.004.
- SECTION 15. Section 822.045, Health and Safety Code, is
- 23 amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (a-1) to
- 24 read as follows:
- 25 (a) A person who owns or keeps custody or control of a
- 26 dangerous or vicious dog commits an offense if the person fails to
- 27 comply with Section 822.042 or Section 822.0422(b) or an applicable

- 1 municipal or county regulation relating to dangerous or vicious
- 2 dogs.
- 3 (a-1) A person who owns or keeps custody or control of a dog
- 4 weighing 40 pounds or more commits an offense if the person violates
- 5 Section 822.0424.
- 6 SECTION 16. Section 822.047, Health and Safety Code, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 822.047. LOCAL REGULATION OF DANGEROUS OR VICIOUS
- 9 DOGS. A county or municipality may place additional requirements
- 10 or restrictions on dangerous or vicious dogs if the requirements or
- 11 restrictions:
- 12 (1) are not specific to one breed or several breeds of
- 13 dogs; and
- 14 (2) are more stringent than restrictions provided by
- 15 this subchapter.
- 16 SECTION 17. (a) The change in law made by this Act applies
- 17 only to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this
- 18 Act. For purposes of this section, an offense is committed before
- 19 the effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurs
- 20 before that date.
- 21 (b) An offense committed before the effective date of this
- 22 Act is covered by the law in effect when the offense was committed,
- 23 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 24 SECTION 18. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
