6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
7	SECTION 1. Section 54.208, Education Code, is amended to

- (b) An [The] exemption provided under this section does not apply to deposits that [which] may be required in the nature of security for the return or proper care of property loaned for the

- 2 (c) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall

- 9 (d) If the legislature does not specifically appropriate

- 16 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act to Section
- 17 54.208, Education Code, apply beginning with tuition and laboratory
- 18 fees charged for the 2009 fall semester. Tuition and laboratory
- 19 fees charged for an academic period before the 2009 fall semester
- 20 are covered by the law in effect immediately before the effective
- 21 date of this Act, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 22 purpose.
- 23 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 25 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 26 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 27 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
