- 2 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act to Section
- 3 54.208, Education Code, apply beginning with tuition and laboratory
- 4 fees charged for the 2009 fall semester. Tuition and laboratory
- 5 fees charged for an academic period before the 2009 fall semester
- 6 are covered by the law in effect immediately before the effective
- 7 date of this Act, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 8 purpose.
- 9 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 10 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 11 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 12 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 13 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
