A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the sterilization of dogs and cats; providing a
3	penalty.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. The heading to Chapter 828, Health and Safety
6	Code, is amended to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 828. DOG AND CAT ADOPTION AND STERILIZATION
8	SECTION 2. Section 828.002, Health and Safety Code, is
9	amended to read as follows:
10	Sec. 828.002. REQUIREMENTS FOR ADOPTION. (a) Except as
11	provided by <u>Subsections (b) and (c)</u> [Section 828.013], a releasing
12	agency may not release a dog or cat for adoption unless the animal
13	has been sterilized [or the release is made to a new owner who signs
14	an agreement to have the animal sterilized].
15	(b) This section does not apply to an animal:
16	(1) that is less than six months old;
17	(2) for which a veterinarian has certified that the
18	animal should not be sterilized for health reasons; or
19	(3) that is a service animal.
20	(c) This section does not apply to an animal that is claimed
21	from a releasing agency by a person who already owns the animal if:
22	(1) the animal is exempt under Subsection (b);
23	(2) the animal is a purebred animal displayed at a
24	competitive exhibition to determine how well it physically conforms

- 1 to an established breed standard; or
- 2 (3) the owner holds a permit for the animal issued
- 3 under Section 830.003.
- 4 SECTION 3. Section 828.0035, Health and Safety Code, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 828.0035. STATE BOARD OF VETERINARY MEDICAL EXAMINERS.
- 7 The State Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners shall:
- 8 (1) develop information sheets regarding surgical or
- 9 nonsurgical sterilization to be distributed by a releasing agency
- 10 to a new owner; and
- 11 (2) adopt rules requiring <u>a dog or cat</u> [an animal] that
- 12 has been sterilized [under this chapter] to receive an
- 13 identification marker in a manner authorized by the board.
- 14 SECTION 4. Section 828.012(a), Health and Safety Code, is
- 15 amended to read as follows:
- 16 (a) Surgery or nonsurgical sterilization of a dog or cat
- 17 [performed in accordance with this chapter] must be performed by a
- 18 veterinarian or a full-time student of an accredited college of
- 19 veterinary medicine as provided by Chapter 801, Occupations Code.
- SECTION 5. Title 10, Health and Safety Code, is amended by
- 21 adding Chapter 830 to read as follows:
- 22 CHAPTER 830. GENERAL RESPONSIBILITY OF DOG OR CAT OWNER TO
- 23 STERILIZE
- Sec. 830.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
- 25 (1) "Sterilization" means the surgical removal of the
- 26 reproductive organs of a dog or cat or the use of nonsurgical
- 27 methods and technologies approved by the United States Food and

- 1 Drug Administration or the United States Department of Agriculture
- 2 to permanently render the animal unable to reproduce.
- 3 (2) "Veterinarian" means a person licensed to practice
- 4 veterinary medicine by the State Board of Veterinary Medical
- 5 Examiners.
- 6 Sec. 830.002. STERILIZATION REQUIRED. (a) Except as
- 7 provided by Subsection (b), a person who owns a dog or cat shall
- 8 have the animal sterilized.
- 9 (b) This section does not apply to an animal:
- 10 (1) that is less than six months old;
- 11 (2) for which a veterinarian has certified that the
- 12 animal should not be sterilized for health reasons;
- 13 (3) that is a service animal;
- 14 (4) that <u>is a purebred animal displayed at a</u>
- 15 competitive exhibition to determine how well it physically conforms
- 16 to an established breed standard; or
- 17 (5) for which the owner holds a permit issued under
- 18 Section 830.003.
- 19 Sec. 830.003. INTACT ANIMAL PERMIT. (a) A person must hold
- 20 an intact animal permit issued by the appropriate local animal
- 21 control authority for each dog or cat the person keeps unsterilized
- 22 <u>for breeding purposes.</u>
- 23 (b) An animal control authority shall charge a fee for the
- 24 issuance of a permit under this section in the amount of \$300.
- Sec. 830.004. CRIMINAL PENALTY. A person who violates
- 26 Section 830.002 commits a Class C misdemeanor. Each animal that a
- 27 person owns in violation of that section is a separate offense.

- 1 SECTION 6. Sections 828.003, 828.004, 828.005, 828.006,
- 2 828.007, 828.008, 828.009, 828.010, 828.013, and 828.015, Health
- 3 and Safety Code, are repealed.
- 4 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
