11	SECTION 3. Section 31.099, Parks and Wildlife Code, is
12	amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (a-1) to
13	read as follows:
14	(a) No person may operate a motorboat in a circular course
15	around <u>:</u>
16	(1) any other boat or personal watercraft any occupant
17	of which is engaged in fishing, waterskiing, or a similar activity;
18	or
19	(2) [around] any person swimming.
20	(a-1) Subsection (a) does not apply to a person operating a
21	motorboat in a circular course to retrieve a downed or fallen
22	water-skier or other person engaged in a similar activity.
23	SECTION 4. The change in law made by this Act applies only
24	to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.

## H.B. No. 596

1 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is 2 covered by the law in effect when the offense was committed, and the 3 former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of 4 this section, an offense was committed before the effective date of 5 this Act if any element of the offense was committed before that 6 date.

7 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
