## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- AN ACT relating to the regulation of roadside vendors and solicitors.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. The heading to Chapter 285, Transportation Code,
- 5 is amended to read as follows:
- 6 CHAPTER 285. COUNTY REGULATION OF ROADSIDE VENDOR AND SOLICITOR IN
- 7 CERTAIN COUNTIES
- 8 SECTION 2. Section 285.001, Transportation Code, is amended
- 9 to read as follows:
- 10 Sec. 285.001. REGULATION OF ROADSIDE VENDOR AND SOLICITOR.
- 11 <u>(a)</u> To promote the public safety, the commissioners court of a
- 12 county with a population of more than 450,000 [1.3 million] by order
- 13 may regulate the following in the unincorporated area of the county
- 14 if they occur on a public highway or road, in the right-of-way of a
- 15 public highway or road, or in a parking lot:
- 16 (1) the sale of items by a vendor of food or
- 17 merchandise, including live animals, except as provided by
- 18 Subsection (b);
- 19 (2) the erection, maintenance, or placement of a
- 20 structure by a vendor of food or merchandise, including live
- 21 animals; and
- 22 (3) the solicitation of money.
- 23 (b) An order under Subsection (a) may not prohibit the sale
- 24 of livestock.

- 1 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 2 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 3 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 4 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 5 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
