A JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 proposing a constitutional amendment to establish English as the
- 2 official language of Texas and require that official acts of
- 3 government be performed in English.
- 4 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. The Legislature finds and declares:
- 6 (1) the people of the United States have brought to
- 7 this nation the cultural heritage of many nations;
- 8 (2) the people of the United States, despite their
- 9 many differences, have lived together harmoniously and
- 10 productively as citizens of one nation;
- 11 (3) the traditional and common language of the United
- 12 States and of this state is English;
- 13 (4) a knowledge of the common language is essential to
- 14 the full exercise of constitutional freedoms, the informed and
- 15 knowledgeable empowerment of voters, citizen checks against
- 16 government abuses, individual prosperity, and independence;
- 17 (5) the English language has been the strongest bond
- 18 among citizens of this nation and has contributed substantially to
- 19 national unity and societal cohesiveness;
- 20 (6) English has been this nation's language by custom
- 21 only and warrants special legal protection;
- 22 (7) government has a fiduciary responsibility to the
- 23 citizenry to ensure that it operates as efficiently as possible,
- 24 and the growth of multiple language bureaucracies and printing

- 1 represents an abrogation of this fiduciary responsibility; and
- 2 (8) this state, its political subdivisions, and the
- 3 federal government have a responsibility to ensure that citizens
- 4 have opportunities to learn English.
- 5 SECTION 2. Article XVI, Texas Constitution, is amended by
- 6 adding Section 74 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 74. (a) In this section, "official act of government"
- 8 means:
- 9 (1) an action of this state or a political subdivision
- 10 of this state that carries the full weight and authority of law;
- 11 (2) an official document recorded or first maintained
- 12 on or after December 1, 2011, by this state or a political
- 13 subdivision of this state for the public domain, including a tax
- 14 record, professional license, deed, real estate record, or publicly
- 15 probated will or other document of a court system; or
- 16 (3) a public proceeding of a governing body of this
- 17 state or a political subdivision of this state held on or after
- 18 December 1, 2011.
- (b) It is the purpose of this section to preserve, protect,
- 20 and strengthen the unifying role of English as the official
- 21 language of this state.
- 22 <u>(c) English is the official language of this state and is</u>
- 23 the language of official acts of government.
- 24 (d) This state or a political subdivision of this state may
- 25 not make any policy expressing a preference for any language other
- 26 than English or diminishing or ignoring the unifying role of
- 27 English as designated by this section, except as provided by

- 1 Subsection (f). 2 (e) An elected or appointed officer of this state or a 3 political subdivision of this state shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that the role of English as the official language of this 4 5 state is preserved and enhanced. 6 (f) This section does not: 7 (1) supersede contrary provisions imposed under 8 federal law; 9 (2) prohibit the use of another language for the 10 public safety, health, or justice; (3) prohibit instruction in foreign language courses; 11 12 (4) prohibit instruction designed to aid students with limited English proficiency in their transition and integration 13 14 into the education system; 15 (5) prohibit the promotion of international commerce 16 or tourism; or 17 (6) prohibit a court or an administrative agency from admitting into evidence or relying on a record that is from another 18 19 jurisdiction and originally written in another language, if the court or agency determines the record is necessary for a proceeding 20 or hearing. 21
- 22 (g) The Legislature or a governing body of a political 23 subdivision of this state may not appropriate any money to promote 24 the use of or demonstrate a preference for any language other than 25 the official language, except as provided by Subsection (f).
- 26 (h) This section may not be:
- 27 (1) construed in any way to infringe on the rights of

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- 1 citizens, who have every right to choose their own primary
- 2 language, in the use of language for private conduct; or
- 3 (2) used to dictate language policies for the
- 4 operation and administration of organizations or businesses in the
- 5 private sector.
- 6 SECTION 3. This proposed constitutional amendment shall be
- 7 submitted to the voters at an election to be held November 8, 2011.
- 8 The ballot shall be printed to permit voting for or against the
- 9 proposition: "The constitutional amendment to establish English as
- 10 the official language of Texas and to require that official acts of
- 11 government be performed in English."
