A JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 proposing a constitutional amendment authorizing the legislature
- 2 to permit a county to issue bonds or notes to finance the
- 3 development or redevelopment of an unproductive, underdeveloped,
- 4 or blighted area and to pledge for repayment of the bonds or notes
- 5 increases in ad valorem taxes imposed by the county on property in
- 6 the area.
- 7 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 8 SECTION 1. Section 1-g(b), Article VIII, Texas
- 9 Constitution, is amended to read as follows:
- 10 (b) The legislature by general law may authorize an
- 11 incorporated city or town or a county to issue bonds or notes to
- 12 finance the development or redevelopment of an unproductive,
- 13 underdeveloped, or blighted area within the city, [or] town, or
- 14 county and to pledge for repayment of those bonds or notes increases
- 15 in ad valorem tax revenues imposed on property in the area by the
- 16 city, [ex] town, or county and other political subdivisions.
- 17 SECTION 2. This proposed constitutional amendment shall be
- 18 submitted to the voters at an election to be held November 8, 2011.
- 19 The ballot shall be printed to permit voting for or against the
- 20 proposition: "The constitutional amendment authorizing the
- 21 legislature to permit a county to issue bonds or notes to finance
- 22 the development or redevelopment of an unproductive,
- 23 underdeveloped, or blighted area and to pledge for repayment of the
- 24 bonds or notes increases in ad valorem taxes imposed by the county

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- $1\,$ on property in the area. The amendment does not provide authority
- 2 for increasing ad valorem tax rates."
