4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 15.992, Water Code, is amended by
6	amending Subdivision (2) and adding Subdivision (3-a) to read as
7	follows:
8	(2) "Federal agency" means an agency or other entity
9	of the United States, including the United States Department of
10	Agriculture or an agency or entity that is acting through or on
11	behalf of that department.
12	(3-a) "Nonprofit water supply or sewer service
13	corporation" means a corporation operating under Chapter 67.
14	SECTION 2. Section 15.993, Water Code, is amended to read as
15	follows:
16	Sec. 15.993. FUND. The rural water assistance fund is a
17	special fund in the state treasury. The fund consists of:
18	(1) money directly appropriated to the board <u>for a</u>
19	purpose of the fund;
20	(2) repayment of principal and interest from loans
21	made from the fund not otherwise needed as a source of revenue
22	pursuant to Section 17.9615(b);
23	(3) money transferred by the board from any sources
24	available; [and]

No. 360 1 (4) interest earned on the investment of money in the 2 fund and depository interest allocable to the fund; 3 (5) money transferred to the fund from the water assistance fund in accordance with Section 15.011(b), including 4 proceeds from the sale of political subdivision bonds by the board 5 to the Texas Water Resources Finance Authority that are deposited 6 7 in the water assistance fund as provided by Section 17.0871; (6) money from gifts, grants, or donations to the 8 9 fund; and 10 (7) any other fees or sources of revenue that the legislature may dedicate for deposit to the fund. 11 SECTION 3. Section 15.994, Water Code, is amended by 12 amending Subsections (a), (b), (c), and (e) and adding Subsection 13 (h) to read as follows: 14 The fund may be used to provide low-interest loans to 15 (a) 16 rural political subdivisions for: (1) water or water-related projects and for water 17 18 quality enhancement projects, including: 19 (A) the construction of infrastructure facilities for wholesale or retail water or sewer service; 20 (B) desalination projects; 21 22 (C) the purchase or lease of water well fields; (D) property necessary for water well fields; 23 $[\tau]$ the purchase or lease of rights to 24 (E) 25 produce groundwater; 26 (F) $[\tau]$ onsite or wetland wastewater treatment facilities; $[-\tau]$ and 27

1 (G) the interim financing of construction 2 projects; (2) water projects included in the state water plan or 3 4 a regional water plan; 5 (3) development of groundwater sources and acquisition of water rights, including groundwater and surface 6 7 water rights; (4) the acquisition of retail public utilities as 8 9 defined by Section 13.002; 10 (5) the acquisition of water supply or sewer service 11 facilities or systems owned by municipalities or other political subdivisions; 12 13 (6) construction, acquisition, or improvement of 14 water and wastewater projects to provide service to an economically 15 distressed area; 16 (7) planning and design costs, permitting costs, and other costs associated with state or federal regulatory activities 17 with respect to a project; and 18 (8) obtaining[-19 [(b) The fund may be used to enable a rural political 20 subdivision to obtain] water or wastewater service supplied by 21 other [larger] political subdivisions or financing [to finance] the 22 consolidation neighboring political 23 or regionalizing of subdivisions, or both. 24 25 (b) The fund may be used to provide zero interest loans, negative interest loans, loan forgiveness, or grants for any 26 27 purpose described by Subsection (a) under criteria developed by the

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1 board.

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(c) <u>The board may use money in the</u> [The] fund <u>to contract for</u>
[may be used to finance an] outreach, financial, and technical
assistance [program] to assist rural political subdivisions in
obtaining <u>and using financing from</u> [assistance through] the fund.
[The board may use money in the fund to contract for such outreach
and technical assistance.]

8 (e) A rural political subdivision may enter into an 9 agreement with a federal agency, [or] a state agency, or another 10 <u>rural political subdivision</u> to submit a joint application for 11 financial assistance under this subchapter.

12 (h) The board may coordinate its review of an application 13 submitted under this subchapter with a federal agency to avoid 14 duplication of efforts and costs.

15 SECTION 4. The heading to Section 15.995, Water Code, is 16 amended to read as follows:

Sec. 15.995. FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE IN GENERAL.

SECTION 5. Subchapter R, Chapter 15, Water Code, is amended by adding Section 15.996 to read as follows:

20 <u>Sec. 15.996. LOANS TO NONPROFIT WATER SUPPLY OR SEWER</u> 21 <u>SERVICE CORPORATIONS. (a) In addition to any other method of</u> 22 <u>providing financial assistance authorized by this subchapter, the</u> 23 <u>board may make financial assistance available to an applicant that</u> 24 <u>is a nonprofit water supply or sewer service corporation by</u> 25 <u>entering into a loan agreement with the applicant.</u> 26 (b) To be eligible to receive financial assistance under

27 this section, the applicant must:

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1	(1) execute a promissory note for the full amount of
2	the loan; and
3	(2) provide to the board an attorney's opinion stating
4	that the applicant has the authority to incur the debt.
5	(c) An applicant for financial assistance under this
6	section is not required to appoint or employ:
7	(1) a bond counsel; or
8	(2) a financial advisor.
9	SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
