- 3 oil-related or gas-related wells; providing a penalty.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. The heading to Subchapter M, Chapter 91, Natural
- 6 Resources Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 SUBCHAPTER M. WELL [ELECTRIC] LOGS
- 8 SECTION 2. Sections 91.551(a)(1) and (2), Natural Resources
- 9 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 10 (1) "Well" means a well drilled for any purpose
- 11 related to exploration for or production or storage of oil or gas or
- 12 both oil and gas, including a well drilled for injection of fluids
- 13 to enhance hydrocarbon recovery, disposal of produced fluids,
- 14 disposal of waste from exploration or production activity, or brine
- 15 mining. The term includes a well that is completed as a dry hole.
- 16 (2) "Well [Electric] log" means:
- 17 (A) a resistivity log combined with a spontaneous
- 18 potential log; or

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- 19 (B) a gamma ray log combined with a porosity log
- 20 [a wireline survey, except dipmeter surveys and seismic wireline
- 21 surveys, run in an open hole or a cased hole of a well for purposes
- 22 of obtaining geological information].
- 23 SECTION 3. Section 91.552, Natural Resources Code, is
- 24 amended to read as follows:

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- Sec. 91.552. WELL [ELECTRIC] LOGS REQUIRED TO BE FILED; 1 CRITERIA. (a) Except as otherwise provided by this subchapter, not 2 later than the 90th day after the date a drilling operation is 3 completed, the operator shall file with the commission a copy of 4 5 each well log, including each borehole section of the log at all depths, [a basic electric log] run after September 1, 2013 6 [September 1, 1985], in conjunction with the drilling or deepening 7 8 the well that meets basic criteria established by the Each well log must be filed with the commission 9 electronically in a manner acceptable to the commission if the 10 commission has the technological capability to receive the 11 12 electronic filing.
- 13 (b) The commission by rule shall establish criteria for well 14 [basic electric] logs to be filed with the commission.
- (c) Not later than the deadline prescribed by Subsection (a)

 for the filing of each well log, an operator shall file with the

 commission a copy of a cased hole log run after September 1, 2013,

 in conjunction with the drilling or deepening of a well in lieu of a

 well log run after that date if:
- 20 (1) a cased hole log was run; and
- 21 (2) a well log was not run.
- 22 (d) Nothing in this subchapter requires an operator to run a
 23 well log in conjunction with the drilling or deepening of a well.
- SECTION 4. The heading to Section 91.553, Natural Resources
- 25 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 91.553. AVAILABILITY OF WELL [ELECTRIC] LOGS.
- SECTION 5. Sections 91.553(a), (b), and (f), Natural

- 1 Resources Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 2 (a) Except as specifically provided by this section, each
- 3 well [electric] log filed with the commission under this subchapter
- 4 is not confidential and is public information under Chapter 552,
- 5 Government Code.
- 6 (b) Not later than the date by which <u>a well</u> [an electric] log
- 7 is required to be filed with the commission under Section 91.552,
- 8 the operator may file a written request with the commission asking
- 9 that the well [electric] log remain confidential and not be made
- 10 available as public information. [On filing this request, the
- 11 electric log or copy of the electric log required to be filed with
- 12 the commission may be retained by the operator, and the electric log
- 13 may remain in the possession of the operator for the period of
- 14 confidentiality and any extensions of that period. On filing of
- 15 the request for confidentiality, the $\underline{\text{well}}$ [electric] log becomes
- 16 confidential and remains confidential for a period of:
- 17 (1) three years [one year] after the date that the
- 18 drilling operation was completed, if the well is an onshore well; or
- 19 (2) five years after the date that the drilling
- 20 operation was completed, if the well is a bay or offshore well.
- 21 (f) An operator who fails to timely file with the commission
- 22 a written request under Subsection (b) that <u>a well</u> [an electric] log
- 23 remain confidential and not be made available as public information
- 24 [or a written request under Subsection (c) or (d) for an extension
- 25 of the period of confidentiality] shall file the log with the
- 26 commission immediately after the conclusion of the period for
- 27 filing the request.

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- 1 SECTION 6. Section 91.554, Natural Resources Code, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 Sec. 91.554. AVAILABILITY OF CONFIDENTIAL WELL [ELECTRIC]
- 4 LOGS. The [If the commission requires an electric log to be filed
- 5 before the expiration of a period of confidentiality, the]
- 6 commission <u>may</u> [shall] make <u>a confidential well</u> [that electric] log
- 7 available for inspection during the period of confidentiality only
- 8 to:
- 9 (1) a person authorized in writing by the operator; or
- 10 [and]
- 11 (2) members of the commission and its employees in the
- 12 exercise of their powers and duties under this code.
- SECTION 7. Section 91.555, Natural Resources Code, is
- 14 amended to read as follows:
- 15 Sec. 91.555. MANAGEMENT AND STORAGE OF WELL [ELECTRIC]
- 16 LOGS. The commission may contract with any person for the
- 17 management and storage of the well [electric] logs filed with the
- 18 commission.
- 19 SECTION 8. Section 91.556, Natural Resources Code, is
- 20 amended to read as follows:
- 21 Sec. 91.556. <u>ENFORCEMENT</u> [<u>DENIAL OF ALLOWABLE</u>]. If an
- 22 operator fails to file a well [an electric] log as required by this
- 23 subchapter, the commission may:
- (1) if the well is completed as a producing well,
- 25 refuse to assign an allowable or a change in allowable for
- 26 production from the well [for which the electric log is required]
- 27 until the operator files the well [electric] log with the

- 1 commission; or
- 2 (2) impose an administrative penalty on the operator
- 3 in the manner provided by Sections 81.0531-81.0534 in an amount not
- 4 to exceed \$500 for each well for which the operator failed to file a
- 5 well log.
- 6 SECTION 9. Section 552.113(a), Government Code, is amended
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 (a) Information is excepted from the requirements of
- 9 Section 552.021 if it is:
- 10 (1) <u>a well</u> [an electric] log confidential under
- 11 Subchapter M, Chapter 91, Natural Resources Code;
- 12 (2) geological or geophysical information or data,
- 13 including maps concerning wells, except information filed in
- 14 connection with an application or proceeding before an agency; or
- 15 (3) confidential under Subsections (c) through (f).
- SECTION 10. Section 552.113(c)(2), Government Code, is
- 17 amended to read as follows:
- 18 (2) "Well [Basic electric] logs" has the same meaning
- 19 as it has in Chapter 91, Natural Resources Code.
- SECTION 11. Sections 552.113(d), (e), and (f), Government
- 21 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 22 (d) Confidential material, except well [basic electric]
- 23 logs, filed in the General Land Office on or after September 1,
- 24 1985, is public information and is available to the public under
- 25 Section 552.021 on and after the later of:
- 26 (1) five years from the filing date of the
- 27 confidential material; or

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- 1 (2) one year from the expiration, termination, or
- 2 forfeiture of the lease in connection with which the confidential
- 3 material was filed.
- 4 (e) <u>Well</u> [Basic electric] logs filed in the General Land
- 5 Office on or after September 1, 1985, are either public information
- 6 or confidential material to the same extent and for the same periods
- 7 provided for the same logs by Chapter 91, Natural Resources Code. A
- 8 person may request that a well [basic electric] log that has been
- 9 filed in the General Land Office be made confidential by filing with
- 10 the land office a copy of the written request for confidentiality
- 11 made to the Railroad Commission of Texas for the same log.
- 12 (f) The following are public information:
- 13 (1) well [basic electric] logs filed in the General
- 14 Land Office before September 1, 1985; and
- 15 (2) confidential material, except well [basic
- 16 electric] logs, filed in the General Land Office before September
- 17 1, 1985, provided, that Subsection (d) governs the disclosure of
- 18 that confidential material filed in connection with a lease that is
- 19 a valid and subsisting lease on September 1, 1995.
- 20 SECTION 12. Sections 91.553(c), (d), and (e), Natural
- 21 Resources Code, are repealed.
- 22 SECTION 13. The changes in law made by this Act apply only
- 23 to a drilling operation that is completed on or after the effective
- 24 date of this Act. A drilling operation that is completed before the
- 25 effective date of this Act is subject to the law in effect on the
- 26 date of completion, and that law is continued in effect for that
- 27 purpose.

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1 SECTION 14. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
