H.B. No. 1435

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

relating to certain notices, reports, and descriptions provided by
or filed with court and county clerks.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Article 46C.003, Code of Criminal Procedure, is
amended to read as follows:

Art. 46C.003. VICTIM NOTIFICATION OF RELEASE. If the court
issues an order that requires the release of an acquitted person on
discharge or on a regimen of outpatient care, the person designated
as the victim assistance coordinator for the court under Article
56.04 [~~clerk of the court issuing the order~~], using the information
provided on any victim impact statement received by the court under
Article 56.03 or other information made available to the court,
shall notify the victim or the victim's guardian or close relative
of the release. [~~Notwithstanding Article 56.03(f), the clerk of~~
~~the court may inspect a victim impact statement for the purpose of~~
~~notification under this article.~~]

SECTION 2. Section 58.110(c), Family Code, is amended to
read as follows:

(c) The clerk of the court exercising jurisdiction over a
juvenile offender's case shall report the disposition of the case
to the department. [~~A clerk of the court who violates this~~
~~subsection commits an offense. An offense under this subsection is~~
~~a Class C misdemeanor.~~]

1 SECTION 3. Section 85.042(a-1), Family Code, is amended to
2 read as follows:

3 (a-1) This subsection applies only if the respondent, at the
4 time of issuance of an original or modified protective order under
5 this subtitle, is a member of the state military forces or is
6 serving in the armed forces of the United States in an active-duty
7 status and the respondent or the respondent's attorney provides to
8 the clerk of the court the mailing address of the staff judge
9 advocate or provost marshal, as applicable. In addition to
10 complying with Subsection (a), the clerk of the court shall also
11 provide a copy of the protective order and the information
12 described by that subsection to the staff judge advocate at Joint
13 Force Headquarters or the provost marshal of the military
14 installation to which the respondent is assigned with the intent
15 that the commanding officer will be notified, as applicable.

16 SECTION 4. Section 402.010(a), Government Code, is amended
17 to read as follows:

18 (a) In an action in which a party to the litigation files a
19 petition, motion, or other pleading challenging the
20 constitutionality of a statute of this state, the party filing the
21 petition, motion, or other pleading [~~court~~] shall, if the attorney
22 general is not a party to or counsel involved in the litigation,
23 serve notice of the constitutional question and a copy of the
24 petition, motion, or other pleading that raises the challenge on
25 the attorney general either by certified or registered mail or
26 electronically to an e-mail address designated by the attorney
27 general for the purposes of this section. Notice under this

1 section must identify the statute in question, state the basis for
2 the challenge, and specify the petition, motion, or other pleading
3 that raises the challenge.

4 SECTION 5. Sections 363.064(b) and (c), Health and Safety
5 Code, are amended to read as follows:

6 (b) If the boundaries of a municipal solid waste unit that
7 is no longer operating are known to be wholly on an identifiable
8 tract, the council of governments for the area in which the former
9 landfill unit is located shall notify the owner of land that
10 overlays the former landfill unit of the former use of the land and
11 shall notify the county clerk of the county or counties in which the
12 former landfill unit is located of the former use. The notice to the
13 county clerk must include:

14 (1) a description of the exact boundaries of the
15 former landfill unit or, if the exact boundaries are not known, the
16 best approximation of each unit's boundaries;

17 (2) a legal description of the parcel or parcels of
18 land in which the former landfill unit is located;

19 (3) notice of the former landfill unit's former use;
20 and

21 (4) notice of the restrictions on the land imposed by
22 this subchapter. [~~The notice requirements of this subsection do not~~
23 apply if the exact boundaries of a former landfill unit are not
24 known.]

25 (c) The county clerk shall record the descriptions and
26 notices submitted by a council of governments under Subsection (b).
27 The county clerk may prescribe the method of arranging and indexing

1 the descriptions and notices [~~on the deed records of land formerly~~
2 ~~used as a municipal solid waste landfill a description of the exact~~
3 ~~boundaries of the former landfill unit, or, if the exact boundaries~~
4 ~~are not known, the best approximation of each unit's boundaries,~~
5 ~~together with a legal description of the parcel or parcels of land~~
6 ~~in which the former landfill unit is located, notice of its former~~
7 ~~use, and notice of the restrictions on the development or lease of~~
8 ~~the land imposed by this subchapter]. The county clerk shall make
9 the descriptions and notices [~~records~~] available for public
10 inspection.~~

11 SECTION 6. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
12 an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. An
13 offense committed before the effective date of this Act is governed
14 by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed, and the
15 former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of
16 this section, an offense was committed before the effective date of
17 this Act if any element of the offense occurred before that date.

18 SECTION 7. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
19 a notice, report, or description provided or filed on or after the
20 effective date of this Act.

21 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
