A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to licensing and regulation of auctioneers; authorizing a
3	fee.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 1802.001, Occupations Code, is amended
6	by amending Subdivisions (3) and (5) and adding Subdivisions (10),
7	(11), (12), and (13) to read as follows:
8	(3) "Auction" means the sale of property by
9	competitive bid using any method, format, or venue.
10	(5) "Auctioneer" means <u>any person</u> [an individual] who:
11	(A) sells or offers to sell property at auction,
12	with or without receiving [valuable] consideration; or
13	(B) solicits, negotiates, or executes an auction
14	<pre>listing contract [, as a bid caller].</pre>
15	(10) "Personal property" means any property other than
16	real property, including all tangible and intangible types of
17	property.

- 18 <u>(11) "Real property" means land, including</u>
- 19 improvements, fixtures, and other property appurtenant to or used
- 20 in connection with the land, and any other estate, interest, or
- 21 <u>legal or equitable right in the land, improvement, fixture, or</u>
- 22 <u>appurtenant property.</u>
- 23 (12) "Recurring basis" means more than once every 24
- 24 months.

- 1 (13) "Sealed bid auction" means a sealed bidding
- 2 procedure that incorporates or allows for the competitive
- 3 increasing or decreasing of bids after the opening of sealed bids.
- 4 SECTION 2. Sections 1802.002 and 1802.003, Occupations
- 5 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 1802.002. APPLICABILITY. (a) This chapter does not
- 7 apply to:
- 8 (1) a sale conducted by order of a United States court
- 9 under Title 11, United States Code;
- 10 (2) a sale conducted by an employee of the United
- 11 States, this state, or a political subdivision of this state in the
- 12 course and scope of employment;
- 13 (3) a sale conducted by a charitable, religious, or
- 14 civic organization, including an organization having a tax exempt
- 15 status under Section 501(c), Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or
- 16 organized as a nonprofit entity, if the person organizing,
- 17 arranging, or conducting the auction receives no compensation;
- 18 (4) a sale conducted by any person [an individual] of
- 19 the person's [individual's] property if the person [individual] is
- 20 not engaged in the business of selling property at auction [as an
- 21 auctioneer] on a recurring basis;
- 22 (5) a foreclosure sale of real property personally
- 23 conducted by a trustee under a deed of trust;
- 24 (6) a foreclosure sale of personal property personally
- 25 conducted by:
- 26 (A) a person who holds a security interest in the
- 27 property, including a mortgage; or

- 1 (B) an employee or agent of a person described by
- 2 Paragraph (A) acting in the course and scope of employment, if:
- 3 (i) the employee or agent is not otherwise
- 4 engaged in the auction business; and
- 5 (ii) all property for sale in the auction is
- 6 subject to a security agreement;
- 7 (7) a sale conducted by sealed bid without the option
- 8 of increasing or decreasing the amount of a bid;
- 9 (8) an auction conducted only for student training
- 10 purposes as part of a course of study approved by the <u>department</u>
- 11 [executive director for auctioneers];
- 12 (9) an auction conducted by a posted stockyard or
- 13 market agency as defined by the federal Packers and Stockyards Act
- 14 (7 U.S.C. Section 181 et seq.), as amended;
- 15 (10) an auction of livestock conducted by a nonprofit
- 16 livestock trade association chartered in this state, if the auction
- 17 involves only the sale of livestock owned by members of the trade
- 18 association; [or]
- 19 (11) an auction conducted by a charitable or nonprofit
- 20 organization chartered in this state, if the auction:
- 21 (A) is part of a fair that is organized under
- 22 state, county, or municipal authority; and
- 23 (B) involves only the sale of property owned by
- 24 the organization's members; or
- 25 (12) a sale or auction conducted outside of this
- 26 state.
- 27 (b) This chapter applies to a sealed bid auction.

- 1 Sec. 1802.003. PREEMPTION. A political subdivision of this
- 2 state may not levy on or collect from an auctioneer [or associate
- 3 auctioneer] a license tax or fee as a regulatory or revenue measure
- 4 or require the licensing of an auctioneer [or associate
- 5 auctioneer], if the auctioneer [or associate auctioneer] holds a
- 6 license under this chapter and is in compliance with this chapter.
- 7 SECTION 3. Sections 1802.051(a) and (c), Occupations Code,
- 8 are amended to read as follows:
- 9 (a) A person may not act as an auctioneer of real or personal
- 10 property [or associate auctioneer in an auction held] in this state
- 11 unless the person [is an individual who] holds a license issued by
- 12 the executive director under this chapter.
- 13 (c) An individual [A person] who is licensed under this
- 14 chapter may not act as an auctioneer for an entity unless the
- 15 entity:
- 16 (1) is an auction company owned or operated by <u>an</u>
- 17 individual [a person] who is licensed under this chapter; [or]
- 18 (2) holds a dealer general distinguishing number
- 19 issued under Subchapter B, Chapter 503, Transportation Code, and
- 20 the auction is for the purpose of auctioning vehicles as defined by
- 21 Section 503.001, Transportation Code; or
- 22 (3) is a real estate brokerage firm that is operated by
- 23 <u>a broker licensed by the Texas Real Estate Commission</u>.
- SECTION 4. Section 1802.052(a), Occupations Code, is
- 25 amended to read as follows:
- 26 (a) An individual is eligible for an auctioneer's license if
- 27 the individual:

- 1 (1) is at least 18 years of age;
- 2 (2) is a citizen of the United States or a legal alien;
- 3 (3) [either:
- 4 $\left[\frac{A}{A}\right]$ passes a written or oral examination
- 5 demonstrating knowledge of the auction business and of the laws of
- 6 this state relating to the auction business[; or
- 7 [(B) shows proof of employment by a licensed
- 8 auctioneer for at least two years during which the applicant
- 9 participated in at least 10 auctions];
- 10 (4) holds a high school diploma or a high school
- 11 equivalency certificate;
- 12 (5) has not been convicted of a felony during the five
- 13 years preceding the date of application; and
- 14 (6) has completed at least 80 hours of classroom
- 15 instruction at an auction school with a curriculum approved by the
- 16 department in accordance with the standards and procedures
- 17 established by rule adopted under this chapter.
- SECTION 5. Section 1802.054, Occupations Code, is amended
- 19 to read as follows:
- Sec. 1802.054. APPLICATION FOR LICENSE. An applicant for a
- 21 license must apply to the executive director on a form provided by
- 22 the executive director that establishes the applicant's
- 23 eligibility for the license. The application must be accompanied
- 24 by:
- 25 (1) any fee required for the auctioneer education and
- 26 recovery fund authorized under Section 1802.153 [the required
- 27 bond];

- 1 (2) the required license fee; and
- 2 (3) either:
- 3 (A) the permit number of a sales tax permit
- 4 issued to the applicant by the comptroller under Subchapter F,
- 5 Chapter 151, Tax Code; or
- 6 (B) proof of exemption from the tax permit
- 7 requirement under Chapter 151, Tax Code.
- 8 SECTION 6. Section 1802.101, Occupations Code, is amended
- 9 to read as follows:
- 10 Sec. 1802.101. AUCTIONEER EDUCATION ADVISORY BOARD. The
- 11 advisory board shall advise the commission on educational matters,
- 12 operational matters, and common practices within the auction
- 13 industry.
- SECTION 7. Sections 1802.102(a) and (b), Occupations Code,
- 15 are amended to read as follows:
- 16 (a) The advisory board consists of seven [six] members
- 17 appointed as follows:
- 18 (1) four [three] members who are licensed auctioneers
- 19 appointed by the presiding officer of the commission, with the
- 20 commission's approval;
- 21 (2) the administrative head, or the administrative
- 22 head's designee, of any state agency or office that is selected by
- 23 the commission [executive director of the Texas Economic
- 24 Development and Tourism Office or the director's designee]; and
- 25 (3) two public members.
- 26 (b) In appointing advisory board members under Subsection
- 27 (a)(1), the presiding officer of the commission shall consider the

- 1 geographical diversity of the members [may not appoint members who
- 2 reside in contiguous senatorial districts].
- 3 SECTION 8. Section 1802.103(a), Occupations Code, is
- 4 amended to read as follows:
- 5 (a) The members appointed under Section 1802.102(a)(1)
- 6 serve two-year terms that expire on September 1 and may not serve
- 7 more than two consecutive terms. If a vacancy occurs during the
- 8 term of such a member, the presiding officer of the commission, with
- 9 the commission's approval, shall appoint a replacement to serve for
- 10 the remainder of the term.
- 11 SECTION 9. Section 1802.104, Occupations Code, is amended
- 12 to read as follows:
- 13 Sec. 1802.104. PRESIDING OFFICER. The presiding officer of
- 14 the commission, with the commission's approval, shall appoint a
- 15 member of the advisory board to serve as presiding officer of the
- 16 board. The presiding officer serves for two years and may not serve
- 17 more than two consecutive terms.
- 18 SECTION 10. Section 1802.107(b), Occupations Code, is
- 19 amended to read as follows:
- 20 (b) The advisory board may meet at other times at the call of
- 21 the presiding officer of the commission or the executive director.
- SECTION 11. Section 1802.153(b), Occupations Code, is
- 23 amended to read as follows:
- (b) If the balance in the fund on December 31 of a year is
- 25 less than $$350,000 \ [\$300,000]$, each license holder at the next
- 26 license renewal shall pay, in addition to the renewal fee, a fee
- 27 that is equal to the greater of \$50 or a pro rata share of the amount

- 1 necessary to obtain a balance in the fund of $\frac{$350,000}{}$ [$\frac{$300,000}{}$].
- 2 SECTION 12. Section 1802.156, Occupations Code, is amended
- 3 to read as follows:
- 4 Sec. 1802.156. EDUCATION EXPENDITURES PERMITTED. The
- 5 executive director may use amounts in excess of \$300,000 [\$250,000]
- 6 in the fund to:
- 7 (1) advance education and research in the
- 8 auctioneering profession for the benefit of license holders and to
- 9 improve and increase the efficiency of the industry;
- 10 (2) underwrite educational seminars, training
- 11 centers, and other educational projects for the use and benefit of
- 12 license holders;
- 13 (3) sponsor, contract, and underwrite other
- 14 educational and research projects that advance the auctioneering
- 15 profession in this state; and
- 16 (4) cooperate with associations of auctioneers and
- 17 other groups for the education and advancement of the auctioneering
- 18 profession in this state.
- 19 SECTION 13. Section 1802.206, Occupations Code, is amended
- 20 to read as follows:
- Sec. 1802.206. PAYMENT LIMITS. (a) The executive director
- 22 may not pay a single aggrieved party more than \$15,000 [\$10,000].
- (b) The total payment of all claims by more than one
- 24 aggrieved party arising from one auction at one location,
- 25 regardless of the length of the auction, may not exceed \$30,000
- 26 [\$20,000].
- 27 (c) The total payment of claims against a single auctioneer

- 1 may not exceed \$30,000 [\$20,000].
- 2 SECTION 14. Section 1802.209(a), Occupations Code, is
- 3 amended to read as follows:
- 4 (a) This subchapter and Section 1802.252 do not limit the
- 5 commission's or executive director's authority to take disciplinary
- 6 action against a license holder for a violation of this chapter or a
- 7 rule adopted under this chapter.
- 8 SECTION 15. Section 1802.251, Occupations Code, is amended
- 9 to read as follows:
- 10 Sec. 1802.251. DENIAL OF APPLICATION; SUSPENSION OR
- 11 REVOCATION OF LICENSE. The commission or executive director may
- 12 deny an application for a license or suspend or revoke the license
- 13 of any auctioneer for:
- 14 (1) violating this chapter or a rule adopted under
- 15 this chapter;
- 16 (2) obtaining a license through false or fraudulent
- 17 representation;
- 18 (3) making a substantial misrepresentation in an
- 19 application for an auctioneer's license;
- 20 (4) engaging in a continued and flagrant course of
- 21 misrepresentation or making false promises through an agent,
- 22 advertising, or otherwise;
- 23 (5) failing to account for or remit, within a
- 24 reasonable time, money belonging to another that is in the
- 25 auctioneer's possession and commingling funds of another with the
- 26 auctioneer's funds or failing to keep the funds of another in an
- 27 escrow or trust account; or

- 1 (6) violating <u>a provision of</u> the Business & Commerce
- 2 Code in conducting an auction.
- 3 SECTION 16. Section 1802.253(a), Occupations Code, is
- 4 amended to read as follows:
- 5 (a) Before denying an application for a license, the
- 6 commission or executive director shall:
- 7 (1) set the matter for a hearing to be conducted by the
- 8 State Office of Administrative Hearings; and
- 9 (2) before the hearing date, notify the applicant in
- 10 writing of:
- 11 (A) the charges alleged or the question to be
- 12 determined at the hearing; and
- 13 (B) the date and location of the hearing.
- 14 SECTION 17. Sections 1802.001(2), 1802.053, 1802.062,
- 15 1802.105, and 1802.253(d), Occupations Code, are repealed.
- 16 SECTION 18. (a) The presiding officer of the Texas
- 17 Commission of Licensing and Regulation shall appoint an additional
- 18 member to the auctioneer education advisory board as required by
- 19 Section 1802.102, Occupations Code, as amended by this Act, not
- 20 later than September 1, 2013, for a term expiring September 1, 2015.
- 21 (b) Section 1802.103, Occupations Code, as amended by this
- 22 Act, applies only to the appointment of a member of the auctioneer
- 23 education advisory board on or after the effective date of this Act
- 24 and does not affect the entitlement of a member serving on the board
- 25 immediately before the effective date of this Act to continue to
- 26 serve for the remainder of the member's term.
- 27 SECTION 19. Section 1802.206, Occupations Code, as amended

- 1 by this Act, applies only to a claim filed under Section 1802.202,
- 2 Occupations Code, on or after the effective date of this Act. A
- 3 claim filed before that date is governed by the law in effect on the
- 4 date the claim was filed, and the former law is continued in effect
- 5 for that purpose.
- 6 SECTION 20. This Act takes effect immediately if it
- 7 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each
- 8 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution.
- 9 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate
- 10 effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
