	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
1	AN ACT
2	relating to the authority of an electric customer to choose not to
3	have a utility's advanced meter.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 39.107, Utilities Code, is amended by
6	adding Subsections (k), (l), and (m) to read as follows:
7	(k) An electric utility or transmission and distribution
8	utility that receives from the commission approval of the utility's
9	plan for deploying advanced meters shall send by mail to each
10	customer scheduled to receive an advanced meter under the plan a
11	notice to inform the customer that the customer may decline to have
12	the advanced meter installed and of the manner in which and date by
13	which the customer must decline installation. If a customer timely
14	declines to have the advanced meter installed, the utility:
15	(1) may charge the customer a reasonable fee for costs
16	associated with the refusal of installation and with providing
17	traditional metering services; and
18	(2) may not:
19	(A) install the meter; or
20	(B) charge the customer the nonbypassable
21	surcharge otherwise authorized by Subsection (h).
22	(1) An electric utility or transmission and distribution
23	utility that has deployed advanced meters under a plan approved by
24	the commission shall send by mail to each customer that is using an

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installed advanced meter a notice to inform the customer that the 1 customer may choose to have the meter removed and of the manner in 2 which the customer must choose removal. If the customer chooses to 3 remove the advanced meter, the utility: 4 5 (1) shall remove the advanced meter; and 6 (2) may charge the customer a reasonable fee for costs 7 associated with: 8 (A) removing the advanced meter; installing a conventional meter; and 9 (B) 10 (C) providing traditional metering services. (m) The commission by rule shall establish a mechanism for 11 12 charging the fees authorized by Subsections (k) and (l). The amount of the fee for a customer who declines to have an advanced meter 13 14 installed must be the same as that for a customer who chooses to 15 remove an advanced meter. The commission by rule shall provide for a minimum period between the time a notice under Subsection (k) is 16 17 mailed and the date by which a customer must decline installation. SECTION 2. The Public Utility Commission of Texas shall 18 adopt rules under Section 39.107(m), Utilities Code, as added by 19 this Act, as soon as practicable following the effective date of 20 this Act, but not later than January 1, 2014. 21 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013. 22

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
