- 1 AN ACT
- 2 relating to a list of mental health, substance abuse, and suicide
- 3 prevention programs that may be selected for implementation by
- 4 public schools.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. The heading to Subchapter O-1, Chapter 161,
- 7 Health and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 8 SUBCHAPTER O-1. [EARLY] MENTAL HEALTH, SUBSTANCE ABUSE,
- 9 [INTERVENTION] AND [PREVENTION OF] YOUTH SUICIDE
- 10 SECTION 2. The heading to Section 161.325, Health and
- 11 Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 12 Sec. 161.325. [EARLY] MENTAL HEALTH PROMOTION AND
- 13 INTERVENTION, SUBSTANCE ABUSE PREVENTION AND INTERVENTION, AND
- 14 SUICIDE PREVENTION.
- 15 SECTION 3. Section 161.325, Health and Safety Code, is
- 16 amended by amending Subsections (a), (b), (d), (e), and (i) and
- 17 adding Subsections (a-1) and (a-2) to read as follows:
- 18 (a) The department, in coordination with the Texas
- 19 Education Agency and regional education service centers, shall
- 20 provide and annually update a list of recommended best
- 21 practice-based programs in the areas specified under Subsection
- 22 (a-1) [early mental health intervention and suicide prevention
- 23 programs] for implementation in public elementary, junior high,
- 24 middle, and high schools within the general education

- 1 setting. Each school district may select from the list a program
- 2 or programs appropriate for implementation in the district.
- 3 (a-1) The list must include programs in the following areas:
- 4 (1) early mental health intervention;
- 5 (2) mental health promotion and positive youth
- 6 <u>development;</u>
- 7 (3) substance abuse prevention;
- 8 (4) substance abuse intervention; and
- 9 (5) suicide prevention.
- 10 (a-2) The department, the Texas Education Agency, and each
- 11 regional education service center shall make the list easily
- 12 <u>accessible on their websites.</u>
- 13 (b) The programs on the list must include components that
- 14 provide for training counselors, teachers, nurses, administrators,
- 15 and other staff, as well as law enforcement officers and social
- 16 workers who regularly interact with students, to:
- 17 (1) recognize students at risk of committing suicide,
- 18 including students who are or may be the victims of or who engage in
- 19 bullying;
- 20 (2) recognize students displaying early warning signs
- 21 and a possible need for early mental health or substance abuse
- 22 intervention, which warning signs may include declining academic
- 23 performance, depression, anxiety, isolation, unexplained changes
- 24 in sleep or eating habits, and destructive behavior toward self and
- 25 others; and
- 26 (3) intervene effectively with students described by
- 27 Subdivision (1) or (2) by providing notice and referral to a parent

- 1 or guardian so appropriate action, such as seeking mental health or
- 2 <u>substance abuse</u> services, may be taken by a parent or guardian.
- 3 (d) The board of trustees of each school district may adopt
- 4 a policy concerning [early] mental health promotion and
- 5 intervention, substance abuse prevention and intervention, and
- 6 suicide prevention that:
- 7 (1) establishes a procedure for providing notice of a
- 8 recommendation for early mental health or substance abuse
- 9 intervention regarding a student to a parent or guardian of the
- 10 student within a reasonable amount of time after the identification
- 11 of early warning signs as described by Subsection (b)(2);
- 12 (2) establishes a procedure for providing notice of a
- 13 student identified as at risk of committing suicide to a parent or
- 14 guardian of the student within a reasonable amount of time after the
- 15 identification of early warning signs as described by Subsection
- 16 (b)(2);
- 17 (3) establishes that the district may develop a
- 18 reporting mechanism and may designate at least one person to act as
- 19 a liaison officer in the district for the purposes of identifying
- 20 students in need of early mental health or substance abuse
- 21 intervention or suicide prevention; and
- 22 (4) sets out available counseling alternatives for a
- 23 parent or guardian to consider when their child is identified as
- 24 possibly being in need of early mental health or substance abuse
- 25 intervention or suicide prevention.
- 26 (e) The policy must prohibit the use without the prior
- 27 consent of a student's parent or guardian of a medical screening of

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- 1 the student as part of the process of identifying whether the
- 2 student is possibly in need of early mental health or substance
- 3 <u>abuse</u> intervention or suicide prevention.
- 4 (i) Nothing in this section is intended to interfere with
- 5 the rights of parents or guardians and the decision-making
- 6 regarding the best interest of the child. Policy and procedures
- 7 adopted in accordance with this section are intended to notify a
- 8 parent or guardian of a need for mental health or substance abuse
- 9 intervention so that a parent or guardian may take appropriate
- 10 action. Nothing in this section shall be construed as giving school
- 11 districts the authority to prescribe medications. Any and all
- 12 medical decisions are to be made by a parent or guardian of a
- 13 student.
- 14 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
