1-17 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
 1-18 AN ACT

1-19 relating to a study assessing the statewide need for the  
 1-20 replacement of mile markers on certain highways.

1-21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-22 SECTION 1. (a) The Texas Department of Transportation, in  
 1-23 consultation with the Texas A&M Transportation Institute, shall  
 1-24 conduct a study assessing the statewide need for the replacement of  
 1-25 fallen or damaged mile markers on interstate highways where mile  
 1-26 markers are required to be installed under state or federal  
 1-27 guidelines.

1-28 (b) Not later than January 1, 2017, the department shall  
 1-29 submit a report on the results of the study and any recommendations  
 1-30 to the governor, the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house  
 1-31 of representatives, and the presiding officer of each standing  
 1-32 committee of the legislature with jurisdiction over transportation  
 1-33 matters.

1-34 (c) This Act expires August 31, 2017.

1-35 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives  
 1-36 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as  
 1-37 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this  
 1-38 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this  
 1-39 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.

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
