6	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 171, Health and Safety
7	Code, is amended by adding Section 171.006 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 171.006. PROFESSIONAL JUDGMENT EXCEPTION TO
9	PENALTIES. (a) In this section, "health care professional" means
10	an individual licensed, certified, or otherwise authorized to
11	administer health care in this state in the ordinary course of
12	business or professional practice. The term does not include a
13	health care facility.
14	(b) Notwithstanding Sections 171.018 and 171.064 of this
15	code and Chapter 164, Occupations Code, a health care professional,
16	including a physician, is not subject to an administrative, civil,
17	or criminal penalty for the professional's failure to comply with
18	Section 171.012(a)(1)(B)(iii), 171.012(a)(2)-(6), 171.013, or
19	171.063 as that section applies to a specific patient if in the
20	professional's good faith professional judgment, compliance with
21	that section in that patient's case would be inconsistent with
22	accepted, evidence-based medical practices and ethical standards.
23	(c) This section does not affect the professional standard
24	of care applicable to a health care professional, including a

SECTION 2. This Act applies only to health care services rendered on or after the effective date of this Act. Health care services rendered before the effective date of this Act are governed by the law in effect immediately before the effective date

of this Act, and that law continues in effect for that purpose.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
