1-19 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
 1-20 AN ACT

1-21 relating to employment of a statewide data coordinator in the
 1-22 Department of Information Resources.

1-23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-24 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 2054, Government Code, is
 1-25 amended by adding Section 2054.0286 to read as follows:

1-26 Sec. 2054.0286. STATEWIDE DATA COORDINATOR. (a) The
 1-27 executive director, using existing department funds, shall employ a
 1-28 statewide data coordinator to:

1-29 (1) improve the control and security of information
 1-30 collected by state agencies;

1-31 (2) promote between state agencies the sharing of
 1-32 information, including customer information; and

1-33 (3) reduce information collection costs incurred by
 1-34 this state.

1-35 (b) The statewide data coordinator shall develop and
 1-36 implement best practices among state agencies to:

1-37 (1) improve interagency information coordination;

1-38 (2) reduce duplicative information collection;

1-39 (3) increase accountability and ensure compliance
 1-40 with statutes and rules requiring agencies to share information;

1-41 (4) improve information management and analysis to
 1-42 increase information security, uncover fraud and waste, reduce
 1-43 agency costs, improve agency operations, and verify compliance with
 1-44 applicable laws;

1-45 (5) encourage agencies to collect and post on the
 1-46 agencies' Internet websites information related to agency
 1-47 functions that is in an open file format and is machine-readable,
 1-48 exportable, and easily accessible by the public; and

1-49 (6) encourage the evaluation of open document formats
 1-50 for storing data and documents generated by state agencies.

1-51 (c) Each state agency shall cooperate with the statewide
 1-52 data coordinator in fulfilling the requirements of this section.

1-53 (d) This section expires September 1, 2021.

1-54 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date
 1-55 of this Act, the executive director of the Department of
 1-56 Information Resources shall employ a statewide data coordinator as
 1-57 required by Section 2054.0286, Government Code, as added by this
 1-58 Act.

1-59 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.

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
