Section 550.065(c), Transportation Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 (c) On written request and payment of any required fee, the 7 department or the governmental entity shall release the information 8 9 to: an entity described by Subsection (b); 10 (1)(2) 11 the law enforcement agency that employs the peace 12 officer who investigated the accident and sent the information to the department; 13 (3) the court in which a case involving a person 14 involved in the accident is pending if the report is subpoenaed; or 15 [a] any person directly concerned in the traffic 16 (4) accident or having a proper interest therein, including: [who 17 provides the department or governmental entity with two or more of 18 the following: 19 20 (A) the date of the accident; 21 (B) the specific address or the highway or street 22 the accident occurred; or 23 (C) the name of any person involved the in 24 accident.]

1 local government of this state that has use for the information for 2 motor vehicle accident prevention purposes; 3 (3) the law enforcement agency that employs the peace officer who investigated the motor vehicle accident and sent the 4 5 motor vehicle accident report required by Chapter 550, Transportation Code, to the Department of Public Safety; 6 7 (4) the court in which a case involving a person 8 involved in the motor vehicle accident is pending if the report is subpoenaed; and 9 10 (5) any person directly concerned in the motor vehicle traffic <u>accident or having a proper interest therein</u>, including: 11 12 (A) the driver or drivers involved in the traffic 13 accident; 14 (B) the employer, parent, or legal guardian of 15 the driver or drivers involved in the traffic accident; 16 (C) the authorized representative of any person 17 involved in the traffic accident; (D) any person involved in the traffic accident; 18 19 (E) the owners of the vehicles or property damaged in the traffic accident; and 20 21 (F) any person who may sue because of death resulting from the motor vehicle traffic accident. 22 23 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 25 26 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

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Act takes effect September 1, 2015. 27

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
