- 5 SECTION 1. Section 141.065, Election Code, is amended by
- 6 adding Subsections (c) and (d) to read as follows:
- 7 (c) A registered voter of the territory from which a
- 8 candidate seeks to be elected may challenge the candidate's
- 9 petition or any signatures on the petition. Any challenge must be
- 10 filed in the appropriate district court before the deadlines
- 11 established by Section 141.034.
- 12 (d) A single notarized affidavit by any person who obtained
- 13 signatures is valid for all signatures gathered by the person if the
- 14 date of notarization is after the date of the last signature
- 15 obtained by the person.
- SECTION 2. Subchapter C, Chapter 141, Election Code, is
- 17 amended by adding Section 141.071 to read as follows:
- Sec. 141.071. CORRECTION OF PETITION. A petition may be
- 19 corrected and additional signatures presented to the appropriate
- 20 <u>authority after it has been initially filed but not after the</u>
- 21 deadline for filing the petition.
- 22 SECTION 3. The changes in law made by this Act apply to a
- 23 petition circulated on or after the effective date of this Act. A
- 24 petition circulated before the effective date of this Act is

- 1 governed by the law in effect on the date the petition is
- 2 circulated, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 3 purpose.
- 4 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
