1-19 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
 1-20 AN ACT

1-21 relating to the redaction of personally identifiable information of
 1-22 victims from juvenile court records.

1-23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-24 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 58, Family Code, is
 1-25 amended by adding Section 58.004 to read as follows:

1-26 Sec. 58.004. REDACTION OF VICTIM'S PERSONALLY IDENTIFIABLE
 1-27 INFORMATION. (a) Notwithstanding any other law, before disclosing
 1-28 any juvenile court record or file of a child as authorized by this
 1-29 chapter or other law, the custodian of the record or file must
 1-30 redact any personally identifiable information about a victim of
 1-31 the child's delinquent conduct or conduct indicating a need for
 1-32 supervision who was under 18 years of age on the date the conduct
 1-33 occurred.

1-34 (b) This section does not apply to information that is:

1-35 (1) necessary for an agency to provide services to the
 1-36 victim;

1-37 (2) necessary for law enforcement purposes; or

1-38 (3) shared within the statewide juvenile information
 1-39 and case management system established under Subchapter E.

1-40 SECTION 2. This Act applies to information and documents
 1-41 relating to juvenile court cases without regard to whether the
 1-42 conduct that is the basis of the case occurred before, on, or after
 1-43 the effective date of this Act.

1-44 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
