A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to the creation of a Texas resident driver's permit,
- 3 provisional Texas resident driver's permit, and Texas resident
- 4 driver's instruction permit; creating an offense.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Chapter 521, Transportation Code, is amended by
- 7 adding Subchapter K-1 to read as follows:
- 8 SUBCHAPTER K-1. TEXAS RESIDENT DRIVER'S PERMIT
- 9 Sec. 521.231. ELIGIBILITY. The department may issue a
- 10 Texas resident <u>driver's permit to a person who:</u>
- 11 (1) as of the date the permit is issued, has resided in
- 12 this state for at least one year;
- 13 (2) is unable to present to the department
- 14 documentation issued by the United States agency responsible for
- 15 citizenship and immigration authorizing the person to be in the
- 16 United States; and
- 17 (3) has not been finally convicted of any felony
- 18 offense.
- 19 Sec. 521.232. TEXAS RESIDENT DRIVER'S PERMIT REQUIREMENTS.
- 20 (a) A Texas resident driver's permit issued under this subchapter
- 21 is not valid as proof of the permit holder's identity for a federal
- 22 purpose.
- 23 (b) The department shall:

- 1 (1) designate and clearly mark as a Texas resident
- 2 driver's permit each permit issued under this subchapter;
- 3 (2) designate and clearly mark as a provisional Texas
- 4 resident driver's permit each permit issued under this subchapter
- 5 to a person who is at least 16 years of age but younger than 18 years
- 6 of age; and
- 7 (3) include on a permit issued under this subchapter
- 8 an indication that the permit is not valid proof of identity for a
- 9 federal purpose.
- 10 (c) Except as otherwise provided by this chapter, a person
- 11 who holds a Texas resident driver's permit is subject to the laws of
- 12 this state applicable to the holder of an original or duplicate
- 13 driver's license.
- 14 (d) Except as otherwise provided by this chapter, an
- 15 applicant for a Texas resident driver's permit who is at least 16
- 16 years of age but younger than 18 years of age is subject to the laws
- 17 of this state applicable to a holder of a provisional license.
- 18 (e) The department shall adopt rules:
- 19 (1) regarding the design and content of the Texas
- 20 resident driver's permit;
- 21 (2) establishing criteria for proof of identification
- 22 and residency of an applicant, including valid identity documents
- 23 issued from the applicant's country of origin; and
- 24 (3) regarding the issuance of Texas resident driver's
- 25 instruction permits.
- 26 (f) Except as otherwise provided by this chapter, including
- 27 521.232(b)(1-3), the design and orientation of the Texas Resident

- 1 Driver's Permit referenced in this subchapter shall be
- 2 substantially similar to a Texas Driver's License.
- 3 Sec. 521.233. APPLICATION. (a) An application for a Texas
- 4 resident driver's permit must state the applicant's full name and
- 5 place and date of birth. This information must be verified by
- 6 presentation of valid identity documents issued from the
- 7 applicant's country of origin including a current passport,
- 8 consular document, or valid identity document issued to the
- 9 applicant by the country of which the applicant is a citizen.
- 10 (b) The application must include:
- 11 (1) a complete electronic set of the applicant's
- 12 fingerprints;
- 13 (2) a photograph of the applicant;
- 14 (3) the signature of the applicant;
- 15 (4) a brief description of the applicant; and
- 16 (5) any information necessary for performing a
- 17 <u>criminal history background check on the applicant.</u>
- 18 (c) The application must state:
- 19 (1) the sex of the applicant;
- 20 (2) the residence address of the applicant;
- 21 (3) whether the applicant has been licensed to drive a
- 22 motor vehicle before;
- 23 (4) when and by what state or country if previously
- 24 <u>licensed;</u>
- 25 (5) the county of residence of the applicant.
- 26 (d) If the applicant is younger than 21 years of age, the
- 27 application must state whether the applicant has completed a driver

- 1 education course required by Section 521.1601.
- 2 (e) Information supplied to the department relating to an
- 3 applicant's medical history is for the confidential use of the
- 4 department and may not be disclosed to any person or used as
- 5 evidence in a legal proceeding other than a proceeding under
- 6 Subchapter N. This subsection does not apply to information
- 7 provided by an applicant under Subsection (g).
- 8 <u>(f) Information supplied to the department relating to</u>
- 9 applicant's criminal history or immigration status is for the
- 10 confidential use of the department and may not be disclosed to any
- 11 person or used as evidence in a legal proceeding.
- 12 (g) The application must provide space for the applicant to
- 13 voluntarily list any health condition that may impede communication
- 14 with a peace officer as evidenced by a written statement from a
- 15 licensed physician.
- Sec. 521.234. FEES. (a) The fee for applying for an
- 17 <u>original Texas resident driver's permit is \$50.</u>
- 18 (b) The fee for issuance or renewal of a Texas resident
- 19 driver's permit is \$24.
- 20 (c) The fee for issuance of a provisional Texas resident
- 21 driver's permit or Texas resident driver's instruction permit is
- 22 \$15.
- Sec. 521.235. EXPIRATION. (a) Each Texas resident
- 24 driver's permit issued under this subchapter expires two years
- 25 after the date of issuance.
- 26 (b) Each provisional Texas resident driver's permit and
- 27 Texas resident driver's instruction permit issued under this

- 1 subchapter expires on the 18th birthday of the permit holder.
- 2 Sec. 521.236. FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITY REQUIREMENT.
- 3 (a) A Texas resident driver's permit is invalid if, on request of a
- 4 peace officer, the permit holder is unable to provide evidence of
- 5 financial responsibility for a motor vehicle the permit holder is
- 6 operating.
- 7 (b) A holder of a Texas resident driver's permit who cannot
- 8 provide evidence of financial responsibility commits an offense
- 9 punishable under Section 521.457.
- 10 SECTION 2. Section 521.457(a), Transportation Code, is
- 11 amended to read as follows:
- 12 (a) A person commits an offense if the person operates a
- 13 motor vehicle on a highway:
- 14 (1) after the person's driver's license has been
- 15 canceled under this chapter if the person does not have a license
- 16 that was subsequently issued under this chapter;
- 17 (2) during a period that the person's driver's license
- 18 or privilege is suspended or revoked under any law of this state;
- 19 (3) while the person's driver's license is expired if
- 20 the license expired during a period of suspension; [ex]
- 21 (4) after renewal of the person's driver's license has
- 22 been denied under any law of this state, if the person does not have
- 23 a driver's license subsequently issued under this chapter; or
- 24 (5) if the person holds a Texas resident driver's
- 25 permit issued under Subchapter K-1 and is unable to provide
- 26 evidence of financial responsibility for a vehicle the permit
- 27 holder is operating, as required under Section 521.236.

- 1 SECTION 3. Not later than January 1, 2016, the Department of
- 2 Public Safety of the State of Texas shall:
- 3 (1) adopt the rules necessary to implement Subchapter
- $4\,$ K-1, Chapter 521, Transportation Code, as added by this Act; and
- 5 (2) create the application form required by Section
- 6 521.233, Transportation Code, as added by this Act.
- 7 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
