- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Article 59.06(d), Code of Criminal Procedure, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (d) Proceeds awarded under this chapter to a law enforcement
- 8 agency or to the attorney representing the state may be spent by the
- 9 agency or the attorney after a budget for the expenditure of the
- 10 proceeds has been submitted to <u>and approved by</u> the commissioners
- 11 court or governing body of the municipality. The law enforcement
- 12 agency or attorney representing the state may spend proceeds
- 13 awarded under this chapter only as proposed in the approved budget.
- 14 The budget must be detailed and clearly list and define the
- 15 categories of expenditures, but may not list details that would
- 16 endanger the security of an investigation or
- 17 prosecution. Expenditures are subject to the audit and
- 18 enforcement provisions established under this chapter. A
- 19 commissioners court or governing body of a municipality may not use
- 20 the existence of an award to offset or decrease total salaries,
- 21 expenses, and allowances that the agency or the attorney receives
- 22 from the commissioners court or governing body at or after the time
- 23 the proceeds are awarded.
- SECTION 2. Article 59.06(g), Code of Criminal Procedure, is

- 1 amended by adding Subdivision (4) to read as follows:
- 2 <u>(4) The audit prepared under this subsection is</u>
- 3 <u>subject to disclosure under Chapter 552, Government Code.</u>
- 4 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act to Article
- 5 59.06(d), Code of Criminal Procedure, applies only to the use of
- 6 proceeds received by a law enforcement agency or attorney
- 7 representing the state under Chapter 59, Code of Criminal
- 8 Procedure, on or after the effective date of this Act. Proceeds
- 9 received by a law enforcement agency or attorney representing the
- 10 state under Chapter 59, Code of Criminal Procedure, before the
- 11 effective date of this Act are governed by the law in effect on the
- 12 date the proceeds were received, and the former law is continued in
- 13 effect for that purpose.
- 14 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
