5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Chapter 61, Education Code, is amended by adding
7	Subchapter W to read as follows:
8	SUBCHAPTER W. GOVERNOR'S UNIVERSITY
9	RESEARCH INITIATIVE
10	Sec. 61.921. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
11	(1) "Distinguished researcher" means a researcher who
12	is a Nobel laureate or member of the National Academy of Sciences.
13	(2) "Fund" means the governor's university research
14	initiative fund.
15	Sec. 61.922. PURPOSE. The governor's university research
16	initiative is established to assist general academic teaching
17	institutions and medical and dental units in recruiting
18	distinguished researchers.
19	Sec. 61.923. ADMINISTRATION. (a) The board shall allocate
20	funds in a manner consistent with Section 61.922 and shall give
21	priority to distinguished researchers in science, technology,
22	engineering, and mathematics.
23	(b) The fund may not be used to recruit distinguished
24	researchers from general academic teaching institutions or medical

and dental units located in the state. 1 2 Sec. 61.924. GOVERNOR'S UNIVERSITY RESEARCH INITIATIVE 3 FUND. (a) The governor's university research initiative fund is a 4 dedicated account in the general revenue fund. 5 (b) The fund consists of any amounts appropriated by the legislature for the fund. 6 7 SECTION 2. Chapter 490, Government Code, is repealed. SECTION 3. On the effective date of this Act: 8 9 (1) the Texas emerging technology fund is abolished and all of the equity, convertible notes, debt instruments, and 10 11 other assets held in the fund are transferred to the Texas Treasury 12 Safekeeping Trust Company; and notwithstanding Subdivision (1) of this section, 13 (2) the unexpended cash balances in the Texas emerging technology fund 14 15 are reallocated in equal amounts to: 16 (A) the Texas Enterprise Fund; and 17 (B) the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board to implement the governor's university research initiative, 18 as created by this Act. 19 SECTION 4. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of 20 this section, information collected under the Texas emerging 21 22 technology fund concerning the identity, background, finance, marketing plans, trade secrets, or other commercially 23 or 24 academically sensitive information of an individual or entity 25 having received an award from the fund remains confidential on and after the effective date of this Act unless the individual or entity 26 consents to disclosure of the information. 27

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1 (b) The following information collected during the 2 administration of the Texas emerging technology fund is public 3 information and may be disclosed under Chapter 552, Government 4 Code:

5 (1) the name and address of an individual or entity6 having received an award from the fund;

7 (2) the amount of funding received by an award 8 recipient;

9 (3) a brief description of the project that was 10 funded;

(4) if applicable, a brief description of the equity position that the governor, on behalf of the state, has taken in an entity that has received an award from the fund; and

14 (5) any other information with the consent of:
15 (A) the individual or entity receiving or having
16 received an award from the fund, as applicable;
17 (B) the governor;

(C) the lieutenant governor; and
(D) the speaker of the house of representatives.
SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.

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
