A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

relating to the authority of the Texas Department of Licensing and 1-19 1-20 Regulation to determine applicant eligibility for a license and to 1-21 discipline license holders.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1**-**23 SECTION 1. Subchapter G, Chapter 51, Occupations Code, is amended by adding Section 51.3514 to read as follows: 1-24

Sec. 51.3514. ORDER FOR REFUND OR SERVICE. (a) The commission or the executive director, instead of or in addition to imposing an administrative penalty or other sanction, may order a license holder to pay a refund to a consumer or to perform for the 1-25 1-26 1-27 1-28 1-29 consumer a service consistent with the regulatory program for which the license was issued. 1-30

The amount of a refund ordered under this section must 1-31 (b) 1-32 be calculated based on the amount the consumer originally agreed to pay and may not exceed the amount the consumer paid to the license 1-33 1-34 holder for the service.

1-35 (c) A license holder performing a service ordered under this 1-36 section must perform the service in accordance with any applicable codes and standards of conduct. (d) The department shall establish criteria for calculating 1-37
