BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-23 SECTION 1. Section 62.021, Education Code, is amended by 1-24 amending Subsections (a) and (e) and adding Subsection (e-2) to 1-25 read as follows:
