 1-17 AN ACT

1-18 relating to defining the duties and to the penalties concerning
 1-19 pain management clinics.

1-20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-21 SECTION 1. Section 168.001, Occupations Code, is amended to
 1-22 read as follows:

1-23 Sec. 168.001. DEFINITIONS [DEFINITION]. In this chapter:

1-24 (1) [In this chapter,] "Pain [pain] management clinic"
 1-25 means a publicly or privately owned facility for which a majority of
 1-26 patients are issued on a monthly basis a prescription for opioids,
 1-27 benzodiazepines, barbiturates, or carisoprodol, but not including
 1-28 suboxone.

1-29 (2) "Operator" means an owner, medical director, or
 1-30 physician affiliated or associated with the pain management clinic
 1-31 in any capacity. Each of these individuals is considered to be
 1-32 operating at the pain management clinic.

1-33 SECTION 2. Section 168.201(d), Occupations Code, is amended
 1-34 to read as follows:

1-35 (d) A person who owns or operates a pain management clinic
 1-36 is engaged in the practice of medicine. This shall include, but is
 1-37 not limited to, all supervision and delegation activities related
 1-38 to the pain management clinic.

1-39 SECTION 3. Section 168.202(c), Occupations Code, is amended
 1-40 by adding Subsection (c) to read as follows:

1-41 (c) A violation of this chapter is subject to criminal
 1-42 prosecution under Section 165.152.

1-43 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
