A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

relating to the creation of a rural veterans mental health initiative within the mental health intervention program for 1-17 1-18 1-19 veterans.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Section 1001.202, Health and Safety Code, as added by Chapter 352 (H.B. 2392), Acts of the 83rd Legislature, Regular Session, 2013, is reenacted and amended to read as follows: Sec. 1001.202. GENERAL POWERS AND DUTIES. (a) The 1-21 1-22 1-23 1-24 1-25 department shall develop a mental health intervention program for 1-26 veterans. The program must include:

(1)peer-to-peer counseling;

1-27 1-28 access to licensed mental health professionals for (2) 1-29 volunteer coordinators and peers; 1-30

(3) training approved by the department for peers;

1-31 (4) technical assistance for volunteer coordinators 1-32 and peers;

1-33 (5) grants to regional local organizations and providing services under this subchapter; 1-34

1-35 (6) recruitment, retention, and screening of 1-36 community-based therapists;

for 1-37 suicide prevention training (7) volunteer 1-38 coordinators and peers; and

1-39 (8) veteran jail diversion services, including 1-40 veterans courts.

(a-2) As part of the mental health intervention program for ns, the department shall develop a rural veterans mental 1-41 veterans, the dep health initiative. 1-42 1-43

(b) The department 1 - 44shall solicit and that ensure 1-45 specialized training is provided to persons who are peers and who 1-46 want to provide peer-to-peer counseling or other peer-to-peer 1-47 services under the program.
