BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 51, Government Code, is amended by adding Section 51.3071 to read as follows:

Sec. 51.3071. TRANSFER OF CASES. If a case is transferred from a district court to a county court, the clerk of the district court may send to the county clerk in electronic or paper form:

(1) a certified transcript of the proceedings held in

the district court;
(2) the original papers filed in the district court;

a bill of the costs that have accrued in the (3) district court.

SECTION 2. Section 51.403, Government Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 51.403. TRANSFER OF CASES. (a) Ιf a is case transferred from a county court to a district court, the clerk of the county court shall send to the district clerk in electronic or paper form:

- a certified transcript of the proceedings held in (1)the county court;
 - the original papers filed in the county court; and (2)
 - a bill of the costs that have accrued in the county

If civil or criminal jurisdiction of a county court is (b) transferred to a district court, the clerk of the county court shall send a certified copy of the judgments rendered in the county court that remain unsatisfied, in electronic or paper form, to the district clerks of the appropriate counties.

1-49 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 1-50 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 1-51 1-52 1-53 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 1-54 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
