BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 45, Government Code, is
amended by adding Section 45.194 to read as follows:

9 <u>Sec. 45.194.</u> GUADALUPE COUNTY. (a) In Guadalupe County the 10 <u>county attorney of Guadalupe County shall perform the duties</u> 11 <u>imposed on and have the powers conferred on district attorneys by</u> 12 <u>general law and is entitled to be compensated by the state in the</u> 13 <u>manner and amount set by general law relating to the salary paid to</u> 14 <u>district attorneys by the state.</u>

(b) The county attorney of Guadalupe County or the 15 16 Commissioners Court of Guadalupe County may accept gifts or grants from any individual, partnership, corporation, trust, foundation, 17 association, or governmental entity for the purpose of financing or 18 assisting the operation of the office of county attorney in 19 Guadalupe County. The county attorney shall account for and report 20 to the commissioners court all gifts or grants accepted under this 21 22 subsection.
