1 service or performance required at that minimum level; and 2 (C) an itemized account of expenditures required to maintain the activity at the current level of service or 3 performance, together with a concise statement of the quantity and 4 quality of service or performance provided at that current level; 5 (3) a ranking of activities identified under 6 Subdivision (1) that illustrates the relative importance of each 7 8 activity to the overall goals and purposes of the state agency at current service or performance levels; and 9 10 (4) recommendations to the legislature regarding whether the legislature should continue funding each activity 11 12 identified under Subdivision (1) and, if so, at what level. (e) The legislature may consider reports of the findings of 13 strategic fiscal reviews in connection with the legislative 14 15 appropriation process. (f) The legislature may consider a state agency's 16 17 compliance with the strategic fiscal review process in making 18 appropriations to that agency. 19 (g) Until the board has completed a strategic fiscal review under this section, all information, documentary or otherwise, 20 prepared or maintained in conducting the strategic fiscal review or 21 22 preparing the strategic fiscal review report, including intra-agency and interagency communications and drafts of the 23 24 strategic fiscal review report or portions of those drafts, is excepted from required public disclosure as audit working papers 25 26 under Section 552.116.
