- Amend C.S.S.B. No. 1 (house committee report) as follows: 1
- (1) In Section 17.13, Article IX of the bill (page IX-84), 2
- strike the text for the Department of Information Resources and 3
- reduce the appropriation from the Economic Stabilization Fund to 4
- the department in the amount of \$50,000,000 for the state fiscal 5
- biennium beginning September 1, 2017. 6
- (2) In Article IX of the bill, add the following 7
- appropriately numbered rider and renumber subsequent riders 8
- 9 accordingly:
- IX. . Statewide Information Technology and Cybersecurity 10
- Appropriations to state agencies made in 11 Initiatives. (a)
- other provisions of this Act are increased in the state fiscal 12
- biennium beginning September 1, 2017, by \$46,849,489 out of 13
- Economic Stabilization Funds, by \$2,050,000 out of State Highway 14
- Fund 006, and by \$400,000 out of the Texas Department of Motor 15
- Vehicle Fund for the purpose of implementing information 16
- technology and cybersecurity initiatives. 17
- (b) In addition to appropriations made elsewhere in this 18
- Act, appropriations described by Subsection (a) of this section 19
- are allocated as provided below and appropriations for the 20
- "Number of Full-Time-Equivalents (FTE)" are increased for 21
- agencies listed below for the sole purpose of the implementation 22
- of the initiatives described by Subsection (a) of this section: 23
