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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1-19 relating to certain lottery prize winners' choice to remain 1-20 anonymous. 1-21

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-22 SECTION 1. Section 466.015, Government Code, is amended by 1**-**23 adding Subsection (b-1) to read as follows:

1-24 (b-1) The commission shall adopt rules governing nondisclosure of the personally identifiable information of certain lottery prize winners under Section 466.411. SECTION 2. Section 466.022(b), Government Code, is amended 1-25 1-26

1-27 1-28 to read as follows:

1-29 (b) In addition to commission records excepted from disclosure under Chapter 552, the following information is 1-30 1-31 confidential and is exempt from disclosure:

(1) security plans and procedures of the commission designed to ensure the integrity and security of the operation of 1-32 1-33 the lottery; 1-34

(2) 1-35 information of a nature that is designed to ensure the integrity and security of the selection of winning tickets or 1-36 numbers in the lottery, other than information describing the general procedures for selecting winning tickets or numbers; [and] 1-37 1-38

(3) the street address and telephone number of a prize 1-39 winner, if the prize winner has not consented to the release of the 1 - 401-41 information; and

1-42	(4) except as otherwise authorized by Section 466.411,
1-43	all personally identifiable information of a natural person who is:
1-44	(A) a lottery prize winner and who has chosen to

(a) Subject to Subsection (b), a natural person who is a prize winner of a lottery prize in an amount equal to \$1 million or 1-51 1-52 1-53 more, or who is an owner of a beneficial interest in a legal entity 1-54 that is a prize winner of a lottery prize in an amount equal to \$1 million or more, may on the date the winner claims the prize choose 1-55 1-56 to remain anonymous and prohibit all personally identifiable information from being released to the public. 1-57 1-58

(b) The commission may release or disclose the personally 1-59 1-60 identifiable information of a natural person who is a lottery prize winner if the person chooses to have the prize paid in periodic 1-61

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2-1 installments. The commission may only disclose the information on 2-2 or after the 30th day after the date the person claims the lottery 2-3 prize if the person chooses to remain anonymous under Subsection 2-4 (a).

2-5 (c) For purposes of this section, the amount of a lottery 2-6 prize is the total amount of prize money paid to a prize winner for a 2-7 single lottery prize claim, whether paid in one payment or in 2-8 periodic installments, before deducting any federal tax 2-9 withholdings or other deductions required by law.

2-7 single lottery prize claim, whether pard in one payment of in periodic installments, before deducting any federal tax withholdings or other deductions required by law.
2-10 (d) This section does not prohibit release of a natural person prize winner's city or county of residence or prevent the commission from releasing the person's personally identifiable information to the Health and Human Services Commission or as necessary to comply with Section 466.407 or 466.4075.

2-15 SECTION 4. (a) Not later than December 1, 2017, the Texas 2-16 Lottery Commission shall adopt the rules and procedures necessary 2-17 to implement the changes in law made by this Act to Chapter 466, 2-18 Government Code.

2-19 (b) Section 466.411, Government Code, as added by this Act, 2-20 applies only to an initial claim for a lottery prize in an amount 2-21 equal to \$1 million or more that is submitted to the Texas Lottery 2-22 Commission on or after January 1, 2018.

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2-23 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.

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
