(a) Subject to Subsection (b), the governing body of a 9 municipality with a population of more than 750,000 may adopt an 10 11 ordinance prohibiting a person who holds a license to carry a 12 handgun under Subchapter H, Chapter 411, Government Code, from carrying a partially or wholly visible handgun within the corporate 13 boundaries of the municipality. 14 (b) The governing body of a municipality may adopt an 15 ordinance under Subsection (a) only if a majority of the 16 municipality's voters voting at an election held for that purpose 17 approve a proposition to authorize the governing body to adopt the 18 19 ordinance. SECTION 2. Section 46.035, Penal Code, is amended by adding 20 21 Subsection (m) to read as follows: 22 (m) The exception provided by Subsection (a) is not 23 available to a license holder who is carrying a partially or wholly visible handgun in a municipality with an ordinance that was 24

1 <u>adopted under Section 229.005</u>, Local Government Code, and is in 2 <u>effect at the time of the offense</u>.

SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act in adding 3 4 Section 46.035(m), Penal Code, applies only to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. An offense committed 5 6 before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed, and the former law is 7 8 continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the effective date of this Act if 9 any element of the offense occurred before that date. 10
