2	relating to civil liability for removing certain individuals or
3	animals from a motor vehicle.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Title 4, Civil Practice and Remedies Code, is
6	amended by adding Chapter 92A to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 92A. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY FOR REMOVING CERTAIN
8	INDIVIDUALS OR ANIMALS FROM MOTOR VEHICLE
9	Sec. 92A.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
10	(1) "Domestic animal" means a dog, cat, or other
11	domesticated animal that may be kept as a household pet. The term
12	does not include a livestock animal, as defined by Section 87.001.
13	(2) "Motor vehicle" means a vehicle that is
14	self-propelled or a trailer or semitrailer designed for use with a
15	self-propelled vehicle.
16	(3) "Vulnerable individual" means:
17	(A) a child younger than seven years of age; or
18	(B) an individual who by reason of age or
19	physical or mental disease, defect, or injury is substantially
20	unable to protect the individual's self from harm.
21	Sec. 92A.002. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY. A person who, by
22	force or otherwise, enters a motor vehicle for the purpose of
23	removing a vulnerable individual or a domestic animal from the
24	vehicle is immune from civil liability for damages resulting from

1	that entry or removal if the person:
2	(1) determines that:
3	(A) the motor vehicle is locked; or
4	(B) there is no reasonable method for the
5	individual or animal to exit the motor vehicle without assistance;
6	(2) has a good faith and reasonable belief, based on
7	known circumstances, that entry into the motor vehicle is necessary
8	to avoid imminent harm to the individual or animal;
9	(3) before entering the motor vehicle, ensures that
10	law enforcement is notified or 911 is called if the person is not a
11	law enforcement officer or other first responder;
12	(4) uses no more force to enter the motor vehicle and
13	remove the individual or animal than is necessary; and
14	(5) remains with the individual or animal in a safe
15	location that is in reasonable proximity to the motor vehicle until
16	a law enforcement officer or other first responder arrives.
17	Sec. 92A.003. EFFECT ON OTHER LAWS. This chapter does not
18	affect limitation under Section 74.151 or 74.152 of a person's
19	liability for good faith administration of emergency care.
20	SECTION 2. Chapter 92A, Civil Practice and Remedies Code,
21	as added by this Act, applies only to a cause of action that accrues
22	on or after the effective date of this Act.
23	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
