1-18 relating to procedures for the dissolution of a county hospital
 1-19 authority.

1-20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
 1-21 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 264, Health and Safety
 1-22 Code, is amended by adding Section 264.004 to read as follows:

1-23 Sec. 264.004. DISSOLUTION. (a) The commissioners court of
 1-24 a county by order may dissolve an authority created by the
 1-25 commissioners court if the commissioners court and the authority
 1-26 provide for the sale or transfer of the authority's assets and
 1-27 liabilities to the county.

1-28 (b) The dissolution of an authority and the sale or transfer
 1-29 of the authority's assets and liabilities may not:

1-30 (1) violate a trust indenture or bond resolution
 1-31 relating to the outstanding bonds of the authority; or

1-32 (2) diminish or impair the rights of the holders of
 1-33 outstanding bonds, warrants, or other obligations of the authority.

1-34 (c) An order dissolving an authority takes effect on the
 1-35 31st day after the date the commissioners court adopts the order.

1-36 (d) All records of the authority remaining when the
 1-37 authority is dissolved shall be transferred to the county clerk of
 1-38 the county in which the authority is located.

1-39 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
 1-40 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
 1-41 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
 1-42 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
 1-43 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
