A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

relating to the civil prosecution of offenses involving certain 1-18 1-19 municipal parking ordinances; authorizing a civil fine. 1-20

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Section 601.001, Local Government Code, 1-21 is amended to read as follows:

1-22 1-23 PROPERTY. Sec. 601.001. PARKING ON PRIVATE (a) Α 1-24 municipality by ordinance may regulate the parking of motor vehicles on private property and may enforce the ordinance in the 1-25 same manner that it enforces ordinances regulating parking in public no-parking zones, including the impoundment of offending 1-26 1-27 1-28 vehicles.

As provided by Chapter 682, 1-29 Transportation<u>Code, a</u> (b) municipality with a population of 1.9 million or more may: 1-30

(1) declare the violation of a municipal ordinance relating to the parking of an unattended motor vehicle in the front or side yard of a single-family residence in a residential area to 1-31 1-32 1-33 be a civil offense; and 1-34

(2) by 1-35 ordinance establish administrative an 1-36 adjudication hearing procedure under which a civil fine may be 1-37 imposed.

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SECTION 2.

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This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
