1-15 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
 1-16 AN ACT

1-17 relating to county regulation of roadside vendors and solicitors.
 1-18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
 1-19 SECTION 1. Section 285.001(a), Transportation Code, is
 1-20 amended to read as follows:
 1-21 (a) To promote the public safety, the commissioners court of
 1-22 a county with a population of more than 1.3 million and a county
 1-23 with a population of more than 550,000 that is adjacent to a county
 1-24 with a population of four million by order may regulate the
 1-25 following in the unincorporated area of the county if they occur on
 1-26 a public highway or road, in the right-of-way of a public highway or
 1-27 road, or in a parking lot:
 1-28 (1) the sale of items by a vendor of food or
 1-29 merchandise, including live animals;
 1-30 (2) the erection, maintenance, or placement of a
 1-31 structure by a vendor of food or merchandise, including live
 1-32 animals; and
 1-33 (3) the solicitation of money.
 1-34 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
 1-35 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
 1-36 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
 1-37 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
 1-38 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.

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
