H.B. No. 1342

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to child sexual abuse prevention training for public 3 school students. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 38.004, Education Code, is amended by 5 amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsections (c) and (d) to read 6 7 as follows: (b) Each school district shall provide child 8 abuse 9 antivictimization programs in elementary and secondary schools. The programs must include annual age-appropriate, evidence-based 10 child sexual abuse prevention training designed to promote 11 self-protection, prevent sexual abuse of children, and reduce child 12 13 pregnancy. The district shall: 14 (1) ensure that each student enrolled in the district attends the training each year; and 15 16 (2) provide at least two opportunities each year for a student to attend the training required that year. 17 (c) Not later than September 1 of each year, each school 18 district shall submit to the agency a report on the number and 19 percentage of students enrolled in the district who attended the 20 child sexual abuse prevention training required by Subsection (b) 21 during the preceding school year. 22 (d) In this section, "child pregnancy" means pregnancy in 23 children under 15 years of age. 24

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1 SECTION 2. A school district shall submit the initial 2 report required by Section 38.004(c), Education Code, as added by 3 this Act, not later than September 1, 2018.

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4 SECTION 3. This Act applies beginning with the 2017-2018 5 school year.

6 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.

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
